The Volvo Group has a strong manufacturing presence in central and eastern Pennsylvania. The Volvo Construction Equipment facility in Shippensburg manufactures wheel loaders, soil and asphalt compactors, and pavers. The facility, which also serves as the headquarters for the Americas sales region and an engineering hub, has more than 40 years of history in the south-central part of the state and joined the Volvo Group in 2007. Since then the company has invested more than \$145 million, including a customer demonstration and training center that draws nearly 10,000 visitors per year.

Mack Trucks became part of the state's Lehigh Valley community in 1905 when the Mack brothers moved the company from New York to Allentown. Today, just outside of Allentown, the entire Mack product line is built at the 1-million-square-foot Lehigh Valley Operations (LVO) facility. In 2010, Mack opened a customer center in Allentown – a showcase for new truck models and the Mack Museum – and in 2014 announced a \$26 million investment in LVO to improve efficiency and deliver even higher quality trucks to its customers. In 2016, an additional \$58 million was invested to expand and upgrade manufacturing operations, including \$3 million to renovate the Mack Customer Center.

Pennsylvania has also been home to the Middletown Remanufacturing Center since 1975. The center remanufactures products for Mack Trucks, Volvo Trucks and Volvo Construction Equipment.
