Children (5 & under) demonstrating improved emergent literacy skills **3,571**


Housing



Advancing Equity to Drive Performance and Sustainable Success!

Embedding equity into agency operations ensures that performance management goals are not only met but exceeded by enhancing program efficiency through addressing barriers that prevent full participation from underserved populations. This approach improves outcomes for all client groups, fosters greater stakeholder engagement and trust, and strengthens partnerships, ultimately leading to a broader community impact. Additionally, by prioritizing equity, agencies build a positive reputation as leaders in inclusive work, attracting additional resources and funding to sustain long-term success.

Integrating ROMA and the Whole-Family Approach for Enhanced Effectiveness

Community action agencies should integrate the ROMA framework with the whole-family approach to enhance program effectiveness. This includes setting clear, measurable goals that track outcomes for all household members. Agencies should coordinate their programs and services to address both immediate and long-term family needs, supporting socio-economic stability. Utilizing data-driven decision-making to measure family outcomes, along with regular program evaluation and adjustments, will promote continuous improvement and maximize impact.

Education & Training

The OEO presented 36 workshops and training sessions for agencies across the Commonwealth throughout the year. Topics included Introduction to ROMA, Is Becoming a ROMA Implementer or Trainer Right for You?, A Community Needs Assessment Roadmap, Performance Standards, and more. These interactive webinars were presented on the LearnWorlds platform and are available on demand. Some of these webinars were presented by various partners, including from the Virginia Community Action Partnership (VACAP) and the National Association for State Community Service Programs (NASCSP) Region III. We successfully engaged 244 individuals, which is fantastic! Please note that this number does not include those who watched the recorded sessions.
