


The Department of Social Services supports referring clients to the full continuum of evidence-based addiction treatments, made accessible through the Medicaid ARTS Program.

Clients served at DSS now have access to expanded addiction treatment options.

The ARTS Program has increased Medicaid rates for addiction treatment services, which helped increase addiction treatment providers significantly throughout the state.



Using ARTS to Support Families in Realizing Recovery

- With Medicaid Expansion, our local Department of Social Service agencies have the opportunity to help families access the full continuum of evidence-based addiction treatment services.
- Connecting families to addiction treatment and recovery supports is easier with the **DMAS ARTS Provider Google Map**. You can access this provider map at www.dmas.virginia.gov/#/arts.
- If a client has Medicaid and meets medical necessity, they have access to coverage for **detox, residential treatment, and community-based programs including Peer Recovery Supports and Medication Assisted Treatment** with counseling. *FAMIS and FAMIS MOMS are eligible for all services except residential treatment.*
- Medicaid members have access to **ARTS Care Coordinators** through their Managed Care Organization (MCO). For a list of ARTS Care Coordinator phone numbers, **turn to the back of this page**.
- Non-emergency Medicaid Transportation is an included benefit.

How do I refer a client to an ARTS provider?

1. A Primary Care Physician

Inform clients that they can talk to their Primary Care Physician about substance use. Substance use is a chronic disease that affects many people differently, and health care providers can work with each individual client to determine the best treatment approach.

2. An ARTS Care Coordinator

The Department of Medical Assistance Services partners with MCOs and Magellan of Virginia to provide care coordination which helps clients to navigate treatment options and other supports. ARTS Care Coordinators are a referral source for adolescents and adults with identified co-occurring behavioral health and substance use needs. For a list of ARTS Care Coordinators, see below.
