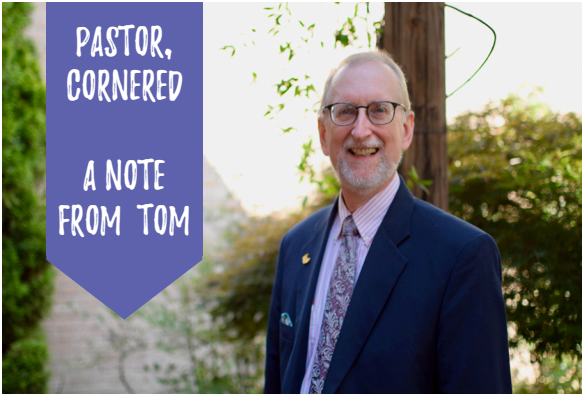

With autumn being upon us, we realize that we are almost in another season that to some degree we can predict: changing foliage among hardwoods before the leaves actually release; holidays like Halloween and Thanksgiving; and of course UT football (predictions abound!). But as we think of changing seasons, it’s helpful to consider that we live our lives in “seasons” and that there is a seasonal nature to Christ’s Church. Our leadership here at FCUMC is being responsive to how this “season” is impacting us and wants you to be aware of its unfolding. Often these decisions are quite difficult. But difficult is not the same as impossible. We keep moving forward.

From the standpoint of church revenues, we are significantly down compared to date in 2018. Based upon what we can officially track in the church office, over 40% of our giving units give \$0 toward the operating budget. Let that sink in. Does that describe you? Surely, this congregation means more to us than to ignore giving anything financially. Maybe this “season” needs to change for you. How we give is an expression of discipleship, plain & simple.

On the expense side of matters, we are on the cusp of a new “season” as well. We don’t know what that will actually look like, but one of the ministries that will be in a new season is the paper newsletter that you are now reading. Between online availability, the cost of professional printing, and mailing expenses, we are considering options that will still effectively communicate while reducing costs. Stay tuned for some fine-tuning in this area.

By now, you have probably received the letter about becoming a 13X13 disciple. Please refer to a separate article in this newsletter for further information. I hope you will become part of this group. There is so much to celebrate & to be excited about. God is using us to live into our mission of Making Disciples...Changing Lives. Though seasons may come & go, God is still God, and the mission is still the mission. I appreciate you so much. Let’s keep moving forward together.

As a congregation, we care deeply about our shared ministry. Together, we are making a difference for the sake of the Kingdom of Jesus Christ. Please consider taking a next step during third quarter of this year towards becoming a 13x13 Disciple, so that we may continue impacting others in a meaningful way.

BECOMING A 13 X 13 DISCIPLE

What does it means to be a 13x13 Disciple? The first “13” represents being the 13th disciple of Jesus. The gospel tells us that Jesus had twelve disciples, whom he named. Surely, there were more. Every disciple beyond those twelve fits into the 13th disciple category. That includes all of us.

The second “13” refers to your prayerful consideration of a 13th month of giving during the third quarter of 2019 (July through September). This means giving an extra month of your regular financial gifts to exceed your typical 12 months of giving. In dollars, some gifts may be larger than others, but every gift is important! There are some among us who aren’t giving at all, so now is the time to step up. It is an act of discipleship.

We could focus on the raw numbers which reveal we are behind in our operating budget by more than double this time last year. But that would seem like begging, and we don’t believe that discipleship should be about begging. Discipleship is realizing that all of who we are and ever hope to be...all that we have and ever hope to have...is a gift. We can continue making a difference in our ministries as a group of 13x13 Disciples.

If everyone makes this kind of an investment, and if non-givers begin to contribute, we could have an additional \$100,000 at the end of September. Without intentional and consistent giving, we will have to make some difficult decisions about reframing the congregation’s financial picture and eliminating vital ministries.

KRISTEN’S CORNER

We have been in ministry together for two months now, but it feels like more. I believe that is partly due to the spirit of worship here. Worship is part of FCUMC’s discipleship DNA. “Let everything that has breath praise the Lord” Psalm 150:6. With three services on Sunday Mornings and the Tuesday night Celebrate Recovery worship, the possibilities to praise are endless. Sometimes when we have options, we have a hard time choosing. Have you ever had the discussion in the family car about where you want to eat and start naming all the options and yet it’s still hard to pick? We are focused on our wants and not

on the opportunity to have a meal together. I think in our consumer driven world, we can look at worship this way and yet, it is what we were created to do. So, how do we balance this as disciples? As we, at FCUMC, seek to be **ALL IN** this fall, let us think about how we do that in worship together, not as a preference choice, but as a discipleship discipline. In the book *Emerging Worship: Creating Worship Gatherings* by Dan Kimball, he suggests that no matter what form our worship takes we should ask these questions:

- 1. Did we lift the name of Jesus up? (Colossians 3:17)
- 2. Did we have a time in the scriptures and invite everyone to be a part of Kingdom living? (2 Timothy 3:14-4:4)
- 3. Did we pray together and seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit? (Acts 1:14)
- 4. Did we show love and encouragement to each other as a Church? (Hebrews 10:25)
- 5. Do we take the Lord’s Supper together as a Church regularly? (Corinthians 11:20-32)
- 6. Were we reminded of the mission of the Church? (Matthew 28:18-20)
- 7. Did we enable people to contribute something as part of the body of Christ? (1 Corinthians 12:27)

I am thankful to be **ALL IN** with you as we continue to worship together as Disciples of Jesus Christ. God Bless, Kristen
