

Briefing Note from Elaine Baxter-Trahair, Chief Administrative Officer

Government relations activities:

Regional

- Chair Henry and Elaine Baxter-Trahair participated in a Federal Pre-budget Consultation Roundtable hosted by MP Turnbull, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Finance, where they outlined Durham's priorities for consideration to be included in the upcoming federal budget.
- Follow up packages were sent to Ministers met with at AMO to respond to requests during delegations for more details on Durham projects and continue conversations on shared priorities.
- A formal submission was submitted to Housing, Infrastructure and Communities Canada (HICC) in response to the federal government's Building Canada Homes market sounding guide.

Provincial

• Following the release of regulations under the Transportation of the Future Act, Chair Henry and Elaine Baxter-Trahair met with Minister Surma and Ministry of Infrastructure staff to discuss next steps for the GO Lakeshore East Extension project.

Federal

- The <u>Major Projects Office (MPO)</u> launched to fast-track nation-building infrastructure projects by streamlining approvals, coordinating financing, and partnering with Indigenous Peoples.
- Five major nation building projects have been referred to the MPO to move forward, and one of these projects was <u>Darlington New Nuclear</u>, which is advancing toward operational small modular reactors.
- <u>Build Canada Homes</u> (BCH), launched, a new agency within HICC, to accelerate the construction of
 affordable housing at scale. BCH pulls functions from CMHC and will focus on leveraging public lands,
 streamlining financing, and promote innovative building methods for community and supportive
 housing.
- · Ministerial changes were announced:
 - Chrystia Freeland will step down from her role as Minister of Transport and Internal Trade.
 - Dominic LeBlanc will add the role of Minister of Internal Trade to his current responsibilities.
 - Steven MacKinnon will add the role of Minister of Transport to his current responsibilities, alongside his duties as Leader of the Government in the House of Commons.
