Government relations activities:

Regional

- Chair Henry attended the swearing in ceremony of Premier Ford's <u>Executive Council</u> at the Royal Ontario Museum, where 37 Ministers were sworn in.
- Congratulatory letters were sent from the Chair's Office congratulating Premier Ford, Durham Regional local MPPs, and the 37 members of Premier Ford's Executive Council.
- Chair Henry met with Minister Nate Erskine-Smith and MP Ryan Turnbull regarding the Region's application for federal affordable housing funds. Minister Erskine-Smith and MP Turnbull toured 1635 Dundas Street East with the Chair and Mayor Roy and discussed the potential for transitional and supportive housing beds.
- Chair Henry and Elaine Baxter-Trahair met with Michael Lindsay, Interim President and CEO, with Metrolinx to discuss the GO East Station Strategy.
- A congratulatory letter was sent from the Chair to Mark Carney, Prime Minister of Canada and a thank you letter was sent to Prime Minister Trudeau as he exited the Prime Minister's Office.

- Other notable changes include Rob Flack as the new Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing;
 Graydon Smith as the Associate Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing; and Vijay Thanigasalam,
 as Associate Minister of Mental Health and Addictions.
- Mark Carney became Canada's 24th Prime Minister and announced a 24-member <u>federal cabinet</u>. On Sunday, March 23, he called a federal election expected to occur on April 28.
- The federal <u>Early Learning and Child Care Infrastructure Fund</u> was extended by five years, with a
 three per cent funding increase every year for four years ensuring continued funding as it was set to
 expire on March 31, 2026.
- Federal Energy Minister Jonathan Wilkinson announced \$55 million in funding for Ontario Power Generation's <u>Darlington New Nuclear Project</u>, which includes four new BWRX-300 Small Modular Reactors under construction at the Clarington nuclear site.

- <u>Lane restrictions on Bloor Street West, Oshawa</u>, for the relocation of Enbridge Gas infrastructure in preparation for a pending Region capital works project.
