Eligibility

Seed Educators serve as visiting faculty for a minimum of one academic year and placed at an academic site where their unique skill set will best meet the needs of our partner institutions.

Physician Applicants

- Be a board eligible or board certified physician at the time of deployment (Winter 2020 or Summer 2020)
- Have an active medical license in the United States at the time of deployment (Winter 2020 or Summer 2020)

Nurse or Midwife Applicants

- Have an advanced degree in nursing (masters in nursing education, advanced practice nursing)
- Have at least 2 years of nursing experience, following advanced degree matriculation at the time of deployment (Winter 2020 or Summer 2020)
- Have experience as a nurse or midwife educator in the classroom, skills/simulation lab, and/or clinical setting
- Have an active RN license in the United States at the time of deployment (Winter 2020 or Summer 2020)
