ATV: Do you hold an ATV Safety Institute RiderCourse Certification Card? If so, consider participating in the ATV Safety Contest. This will be a hands-on workshop. **Certification form is required.**

Clover Quiz Bowl: Are you ready to test your knowledge of all things 4-H? The 4-H Clover Quiz Bowl is the perfect place for you and your teammates to showcase your knowledge about 4-H and the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service. This team event is fun, fast-paced and full of useful information!

Communications: The Communications Contest includes more than just public speaking. It's a communications event, showcasing multiple forms of communication. There's something for everyone! Choose your best form of communication:

- Traditional speeches, illustrated presentations or digital presentations
- Photography – Capturing and telling a story through pictures
- Video – Telling a story/sharing a message using YouTube or other video platform
- Graphic Arts – Designing flyers, graphics and digital materials which inspire action

Fashion Review: The Fashion Revue is a contest that aims to increase youths' knowledge of consumerism, textiles and garment construction while providing opportunities for members to express fashion trends and present themselves in an appropriate manner. Youth should be able to select suitable and becoming accessories and model a garment with confidence made to meet one's wardrobe needs. This contest is an opportunity for each 4-H participant to showcase his or her special talents.

FCS Skill-a-Thon: The FCS Skill-a-Thon Contest is an identification contest in the areas of Housing and Design, Food and Cooking, and Sewing and Clothing. Members will identify 25 items in each category. Members also will judge two nutrition classes. A team consists of three or four members. The winning team will become eligible to compete at the Family and Consumer Science Classics at Denver Western Roundup in January 2020.

Hippology: Want to test your knowledge of all things horse? The Hippology Contest is the perfect opportunity for youth to demonstrate their knowledge of anatomy, nutrition, reproduction, training and all other things horse-related. The Hippology Contest consists of five segments: a written test, a picture identification section, hands-on identification stations, horse judging and a team problem. Each segment will test your knowledge of horses and allow you and your teammates to evaluate horse content through problem solving and identification.

Job Readiness: Want to test your skills for a job? The Job Readiness Contest is the place for you. The contest is open to youth in both the intermediate and senior divisions and will include an on-site application (contestants should bring a cover letter and a resume with them). A phone call will be placed for those being selected to interview during Pete's Picnic and interviews will be scheduled for the next day. Start working on your résumé and cover letter and come prepared to fill out your application during registration. New this year — intermediates will compete in the interview portion of the contest.

Land Judging: Land judging provides a unique opportunity for 4-H members to learn about land productivity, and conservation management. All judging will be done in a computer lab. 4-H members from beginners to advanced are welcome to participate in this educational contest. Tractor Driving: The Tractor Driving Contest allows 4-H members who possess tractor and machinery knowledge the opportunity to demonstrate that knowledge through evaluation of driving, machinery inspection and written testing. Vocal: The Vocal Contest has been giving talented youth a place to share the music for 18 years. In 2017, it also became the audition for Music Corps, a statewide performing group. The categories have expanded, adding not only vocal, but original performance and original composition.
