The NASFLA Newsletter is the official publication of the [North American Systemic Functional Linguistics Association](#) (NASFLA), a professional organization affiliated with the American Association for Applied Linguistics (AAAL) that represents the [International Systemic Functional Linguistics Association](#) (ISFLA) in North America. The Newsletter seeks to disseminate Systemic Functional Linguistics (SFL)-related professional endeavors in teaching and research in North America and beyond. Our audiences include scholars, researchers, students, and practitioners whose work is based on the tenets of SFL.

Published at least twice a year, the Newsletter aims to include contributions that highlight different interests and developments in the field of SFL. Its new multimodal format allows for the entries in various modes (e.g., reflective essays, paragraphs, pictures, videos, etc.). They can cover scholarly work, creative classroom activities, artifacts, trends in the field, ongoing projects, book reviews, personal stories, and recounts of SFL-related events, etc. The Newsletter is a venue for SFL scholars at every stage of their career to report about their work, their concerns and insights in SFL and education, and their scholarly activities in a less formal way. The Newsletter aims to showcase the unique perspectives and scholarship of SFL researchers and connect SFL scholars with each other thus contributing to the growth of the field.

To highlight the theme of the 2018 International Conference in Boston, "*(re)Imagining the Future: Expanding Resources and Making Connections*," we are seeking contributions as short as a few paragraphs to comprehensive essays of 6-8 pages (or up to 2,000 words excluding references). We want these contributions to be original, readable, and innovatively address the conference theme. Deadline for submissions is May 1st, 2018. When applicable, submissions should be formatted according to the guidelines of American Psychological Association Publication Manual, 6th Edition.
