

PANEL DISCUSSION: HOW TO GET THE MOST OUT OF A CONFERENCE—AN INSIDER'S POV



JASON: Hi, Heidi! Congratulations on the accolades and warm reception your debut picture book, *Saving American Beach*, has already received! For those of us who have not yet had a chance to read it, could you tell us what the book is about?

HEIDI: *Saving American Beach: The Biography of African American Environmentalist MaVynee Betsch*, is a story about an African American woman who saved a beach in Florida that was critical for environmental concerns but also because of its history. In the 1930s and '40s, it was one of the only beaches in Florida where African Americans could visit. The story is also about resilience and activism, and how one person can make a difference.

JASON: Wow! I grew up on the First Coast, yet I never knew the historical importance of *American Beach*. Thank you for writing and teaching us about MaVynee Betsch and her legacy. Speaking of writing, what is the best piece of writing advice you have ever received?

HEIDI: Marry someone with insurance.

JASON: Ha! That made me laugh out loud (and cry a little on the inside). What are you currently working on that you are most excited about?

HEIDI: My next picture book biography for children is about John Bonner Buck, the grandfather of bioluminescence and his work on fireflies. He discovered why fireflies flash and a thousand other things about them, but more importantly it's a book about the glory and wonder of science.

JASON: That sounds wonderful, Heidi. Thank you for taking the time to talk with us!


