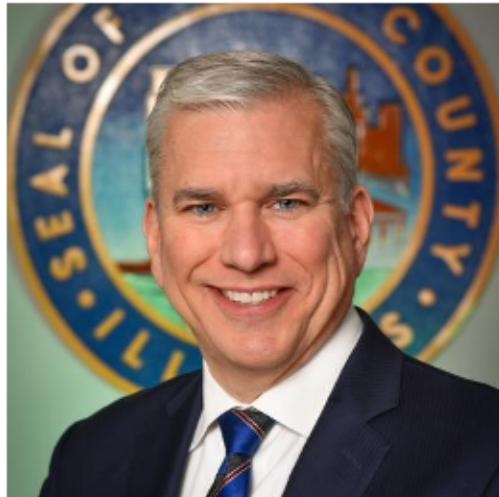

Illinois has distributed the sixth most doses of any state.

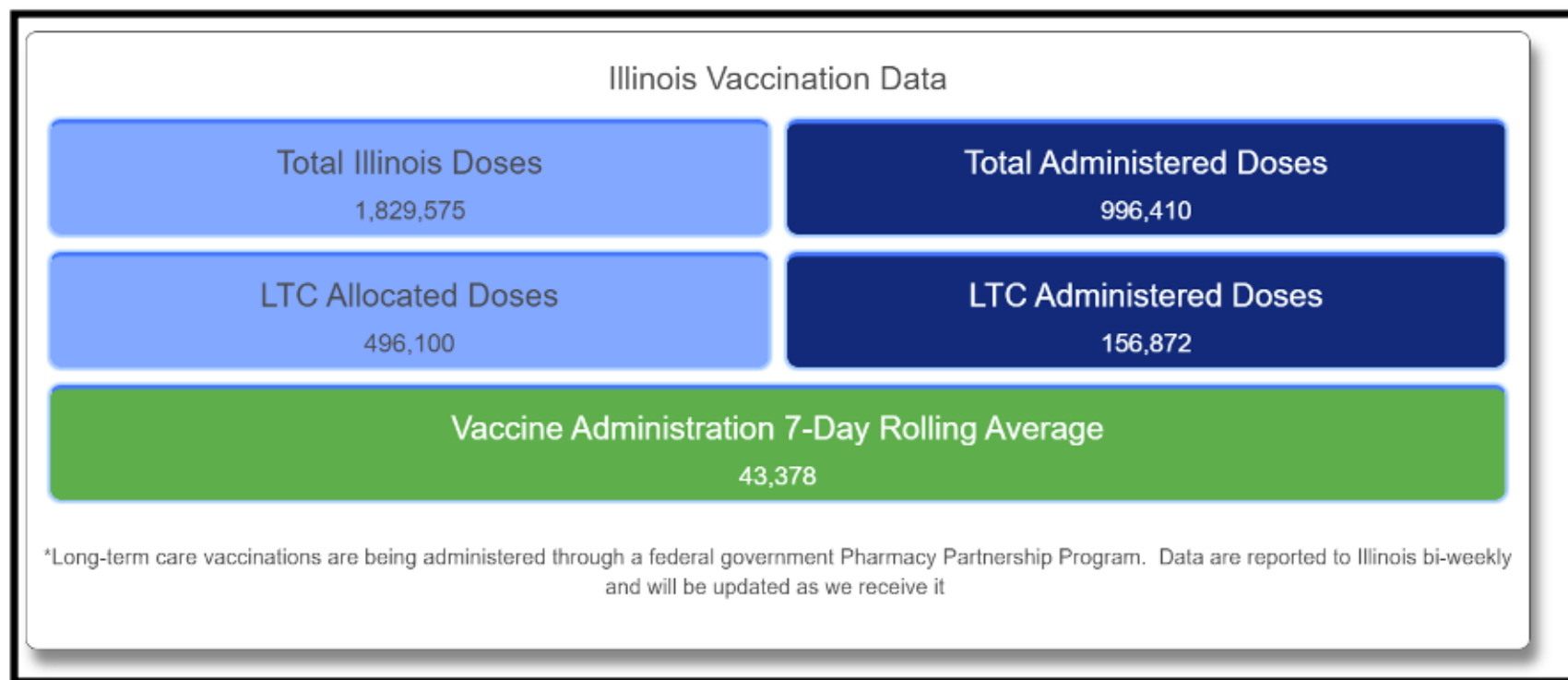

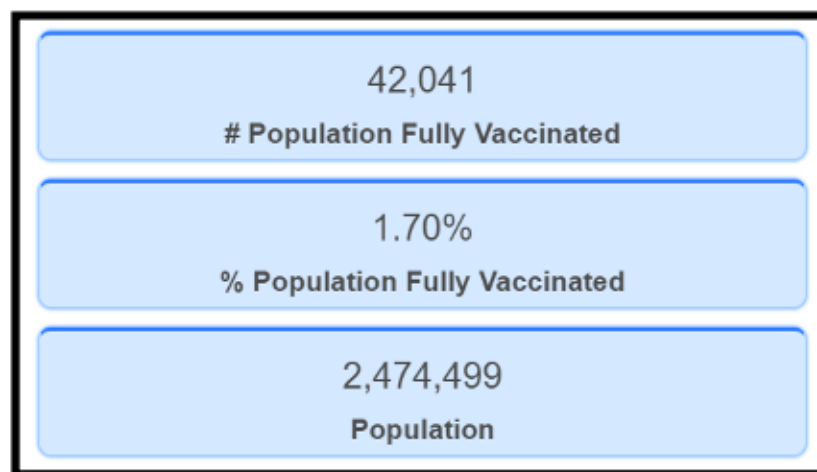
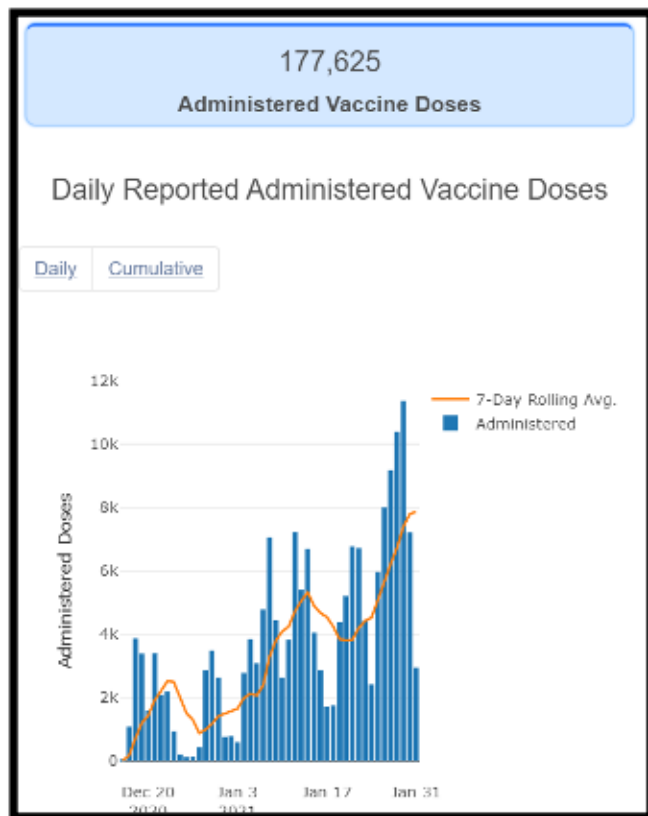

When will I get my vaccine?

Currently, there are more people who want the vaccine than vaccines available.

Suburban Cook County 1b population: 650,000 people
Vaccines received by Cook County last week: 15,000

This process will require patience and vigilance.



Teachers

- Teachers who have already been vaccinated are largely due to unused long-term care vaccines
- The Cook County Department of Public Health is working closely with local school districts to ensure teachers are vaccinated



Seniors

- Long-term care facilities such as Belmont Village, Covenant Living, Solstice Senior Living and The Moorings all have dates on the calendar for residents to receive their vaccines
- These facilities are vaccinated per federal contracts with Walgreens and CVS
- Homebound seniors will be vaccinated via a community approach leveraging local and non-profit resources



Equity-centered vaccine outreach

Barrier 1: Technology access and literacy

- Everyone should have equal access to vaccines
- Technology should not be a barrier
- Please reach out to our offices if you need assistance in registering. We cannot promise helping you make an appointment

Barrier 2: Vaccine Hesitancy

- Public communication and engagement to acknowledge and address vaccine hesitancy
- Messaging through community-based organizations
- Engaging community leaders directly to gain buy-in for mass vaccination sites
- Programming focused in communities with greatest disparities

But I read/saw on Facebook that...

There are numerous rumors about people seemingly “skipping” the line. Some of these stories are true. Some are false. Right now, there is a lot of panic and fear.

There are not enough vaccines right now, but there will be eventually.

This process will require patience and vigilance.



Common questions: Sign up

- Why is it so difficult to sign up?
- Can I sign up with more than one place?
- I don't have/can't use a computer. How do I sign up?
- Can your offices help me sign up?
- How does the Cook County website work? Is there a queue or is it first come first serve?
- Are there two Cook County websites to sign up?
- I am homebound. How do I get vaccinated?
- Why can't I reserve a vaccine appointment a month from now instead of having to keep checking the website?



Common questions: Sign up

- Will Cook County prioritize people based on health condition? How is priority being determined within 1b?
- Are the only people getting the vaccines “connected”?
- I received my first vaccine dose, but can’t schedule the second dose. What do I do?
- Are all Cook County health centers offering the Pfizer vaccine?
- Can I get a vaccine in a different county?
- Can I receive a leftover vaccine that would otherwise be discarded?
- Why don’t we have one centralized sign-up system?
- Why have some teachers/schools already been vaccinated?



Common questions: Distribution

- Why is there only one Cook County vaccine location in the northern suburbs?
- Why do Evanston and Skokie get to distribute vaccines?
- Can my school/church/community center be a distribution center?
- Can health care providers ignore the state's 1b guidelines and give the vaccine to someone outside of 1b with a very serious medical condition?
- Why don't the pharmacies in the suburbs have any vaccines to distribute?
- What are the authorization codes at Walgreens and CVS?



Common questions: Big picture

- Why are there so few vaccines? Who decides how many Illinois gets?
- What are the barriers to speeding up distribution?
- Where is Illinois in relation to other states?
- What steps are being taken to improve the process?
