

Music Ministries

From Matthew Hogan

The hymn tune *Hyfrydol* is very popular. If you don't immediately know how this melody goes, you can simply watch any web worship video and listen to the introductory theme music. That music is based on *Hyfrydol!* This tune was written in 1830 by Rowland Hugh Prichard when he was nineteen years old. Several years later, *Hyfrydol* was published with a number of his other tunes in a hymnal for children called *Cyfaill y Cantorion (The Singers' Friend)*. I found numerous translations of the Welsh word *Hyfrydol*, including: tuneful, cheerful, good cheer, delightful, agreeable, pleasant, pleasing, beautiful, fair, fine, sweet, and melodious.

Many hymn texts have been set to this tune. In the *New Century Hymnal*, this is the melody for "We Have Come at Christ's Own Bidding," "Alleluia! Gracious Jesus!" and "God the Spirit, Guide and Guardian." *Hyfrydol* is also often associated with "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" and "Come, O Long-Expected Jesus." These are only a few of the many hymn texts associated with this tune.

The melody of *Hyfrydol* is amazingly simple, as it only spans a range of six notes. And the sixth note is only used once! The melody mainly steps up or down with only a few leaps throughout. The arrangements in our hymnal are by the well-known composer Ralph Vaughan Williams. The harmonies add interest and support the tune without overshadowing the simplicity of the melody. It is one of my favorite hymn tunes.

Of course, *Hyfrydol* is extra special to our church because it is the tune used for the hymn "Come, St. Peter's." The lyrics by Harriet Ziegenhals tell of the past, present and future of St. Peter's. I find the end of the second verse to be especially appropriate for this past year:

"Through the years of growth and struggle,
Change, depression, birth and strife
Still the Spirit led us onward,
Sending love, renewing life."

Listen for "Come, St. Peter's" and the hymn tune *Hyfrydol* in worship and on the web on May 16th!


