Jesse Raymond Vargas was born in Riverside, California. Graduated from John W. North High School in 1976. He went on to graduate from Phoenix Institute with an Electronics Technology diploma. Jesse was recruited by Burroughs Corporation which later merged with Sperry to become Unisys Corporation. Jesse later received a Bachelor of Science diploma in Business Administration with a concentration in Information Technology from the University of La Verne. Jesse advanced to the level of Senior Staff Engineer with Unisys Corporation in Mission Viejo, California.

Jesse has travelled extensively throughout the United States, Europe, Asia, and the South Pacific before retiring as a Product Support Manager after 35 years. He is also a member of Corona Rotary International "*Service Above Self*". Jesse has 3 grown children and 10 grandchildren. Jesse met the love of his life Karen in 1993 and married in 2003.

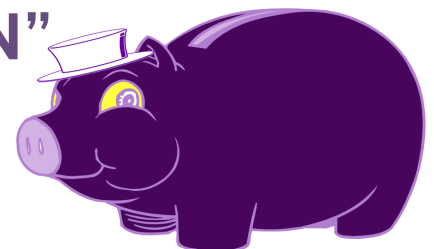
