The Eucharistic Revival

Last month, we explained how the Eucharistic Revival came about and the first year of the three-year renewal. This year, we are now in the year of Parish Renewal. The Holy Spirit's call to renewal can be broken down into four invitations based on the pillars of the Revival:

1. **Reinvigorate worship** - the importance of taking time for Mass
2. **Create moments of personal encounter** - spend time in adoration and confession
3. **Engage in robust formation** - learn more about the source and summit of our Catholic faith
4. **Send Catholics forth as missionaries** - serve the poor and invite those that have fallen away back to church

The Eucharistic Revival represents a call for Catholics to seek to rekindle their devotion, strengthen their faith, and cultivate a closer relationship with Christ through the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

Mission of Renewal: To renew the church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

Vision of Renewal: To inspire a movement of Catholics across the United States who are healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and who are then sent out on mission “for the life of the world.”

What does the Eucharist represent in the life of the Church? It is the source and summit of all Christian life.....through the Eucharistic Celebration we are united already with the liturgy of heaven and we have a foretaste of eternal life. (CCC Compendium #274)

The Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking” (CCC 1327)
