

1. If a student becomes ill at school, then they will be isolated and sent home.
2. Frequent handwashing is a school wide practice.
3. The lunchroom will be used for grades 1-8. Students will wash their hands before and after lunch. Lunchroom tables will be cleaned between classes. PK and Kinder will eat in their classrooms. There will be assigned seating for all grades.
4. Students must bring their own water bottles. Water fountains will remain off but bottle filling stations will be available.
5. Students will be encouraged to keep personal space and physically distance as feasible.
6. Air purifiers will be used in the lunchroom and classrooms.
7. Volunteers will be allowed on campus after being properly screened.
8. The facilities will be cleaned and disinfected daily.
9. HEPA filters installed and used in the HVAC system.
10. Masks are required for staff and students while indoors through Labor Day. After Labor Day, it is up to families to decide if they want their children to wear masks. It should be noted that mask wearing may prevent a quarantine situation in the classroom. If an infected student and exposed student were correctly and consistently wearing masks, then the exposed student would be excluded from the close contact definition and would not be required to quarantine. This is as a result of public health guidance the School is required to follow.
11. Each day families are expected to self-screen for symptoms of COVID-19 and other viruses, and children must stay home if sick. If families have had a close contact exposure to COVID-19, then they should notify the nurse and begin quarantine procedures.
12. Quarantine procedures for close contacts and individuals with COVID remain in effect and parents have two options:
  - **Option 1:** If a person has a close contact exposure to an individual with COVID-19, then they may have a PCR test on the 5th day of exposure and return on the 8th day as long as they remain symptom free and test COVID negative. They will be required to wear a mask and monitor for symptoms until the 14th day of exposure.
  - **Option 2:** If a person has a close contact exposure to an individual with COVID-19 they are not required to test for COVID-19 but will quarantine for 10 days and may return on the 11th day if symptom free. They will wear a mask and continue to self-monitor for 14 days.

All individuals who are 2 weeks past the completion of their COVID vaccine are not required to quarantine with a close contact exposure. They will be required to self-monitor and mask for 14 days of exposure.

Quarantine for a person who is COVID-19 Positive: The individual will quarantine for 10 days and may return to campus on the 11th day if symptoms have resolved and the last 24 hours have been fever free.

\*Close Contact through Proximity and Duration of Exposure: Someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person (laboratory-confirmed or a clinically compatible illness) for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period (for example, three individual 5-minute exposures for a total of 15 minutes). An infected person can spread SARS-CoV-2 starting from 2 days before they have any symptoms (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days before the positive specimen collection date), until they meet criteria for discontinuing home isolation.

Exception: In the K–12 indoor classroom setting, the close contact definition excludes students who were within 3 to 6 feet of an infected student (laboratory-confirmed or a clinically compatible illness) if both the infected student and the exposed student(s) correctly and consistently wore well-fitting masks the entire time.
