Questions for Reflection:

- What are the disciples told to do in the Luke passage? How do you respond to this call today?
- How might we focus more on the diseases that might seem to be more in our reach? Diseases we see and encounter every day. Diseases such as: Sexism, Racism, Injustice, Hopelessness, Ageism, Xenophobia, Homophobia, oppression, fear, misinformation?
- What will it mean for you to be baptized or remember your baptism and accept the commission to go and proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God?
- How can you grow in faith so you will be prepared to share the Good News with others?

Spiritual Practice: Intercessory Prayer

Intercessory Prayer is praying to God on behalf of others. In his book, *Prayer*, Richard Foster describes Intercession as a way of loving others. Intercessory prayer helps us to think about others through the lens of God's desire to transform them into Christlikeness. Adele Ahlberg Calhoun writes in her book, *Spiritual Disciplines Handbook*, "Intercessory Prayer invites us into God's care and concern for us, our families and friends, and the entire world." Intercession is not a means to impose our will and desires for a person, but rather a way to become more aware of God's desires. Intercessory Prayer is a way of partnering with God in his concerns for the world, as we support others in need of healing, care, and support.
