

Coaching Model and Your Role

Coaching is an evidence-based, interactive process of reflection, information sharing, and action used to provide support and encouragement, refine existing practices, develop new skills, and promote continuous self-assessment and learning. Using this approach, some team members may provide fewer direct visits, as the family will implement the provided strategies multiple times a day and across a variety of settings and situations.

A service coordinator is the key contact who works on your child and family's behalf by assessing your family's needs, drafting an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP), and coordinating the delivery of services.
