



#### **Mission Update: Jennifer Bentzel (Sunday, February 5)**

We welcome back Jennifer Bentzel, Foundations and Partner Relations Manager with Corus International/IMA World Health. Jennifer will talk about the merger of IMA and Lutheran World Relief and their new integrated programming. She will also provide a presentation and update on the Yemen Mobile Health Clinics project, which received a \$42,000 Envision grant in 2022. This project is providing critical primary health care services to Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) who were forced from their homes due to the ongoing conflict in Yemen and are now living in camps in Marib. Yemen continues to suffer through one of the worst humanitarian crises in the world, due to widespread hunger, disease, and attacks on civilians. And Jennifer will provide an update on how CPC's mission giving continues to have a positive impact, particularly in Nepal and Tanzania.

#### **Mission Update: Bonnie Harry (February 19)**

We welcome back Bonnie Harry, RN, Director of Catonsville Emergency Assistance (CEA). It's been a busy and challenging year for CEA, with new challenges, as well as exciting new possibilities, on the horizon in 2023. Bonnie will offer an overview of the many ways CEA has provided a ministry of compassion and care in the Catonsville community. She'll share how a recent Envision Grant allowed

CEA to purchase a van that has substantially expanded its capacity to provide food for those with transportation challenges. CPC's faithful and generous support of CEA is making a positive difference in the community. We are grateful to be partners in ministry.

### **Deacons' Clothing Drive**

The deacons are again collecting new or gently used winter clothing for the West Side Men's Shelter. They are in great need of coats, especially very large sizes. Hats, gloves, boots, and long underwear are also appreciated. Bins are available in the sanctuary, fellowship hall, and outside the Church House through the end of January.

## Per Capita Giving

As a member of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and the Presbytery of Baltimore, Catonsville Presbyterian Church is required to pay a per capita assessment for “the ecclesiastical infrastructure that binds our ministry” to the PC(USA). Per capita funds support the operating budgets of the Presbytery of Baltimore, the Synod of the Mid Atlantic, and the General Assembly of the PC(USA). 2023 per capita is set at \$40 per member, which totals \$16,280 for our congregation this year. Though this is not an obligation for members, some people feel that this is an important affirmation of their Presbyterian connection. We welcome these generous gifts, which can be made either online or via a check marked “per capita.” We gladly use these individual contributions to free up budget resources for other ministry needs.

## 2023 Pledge Update
