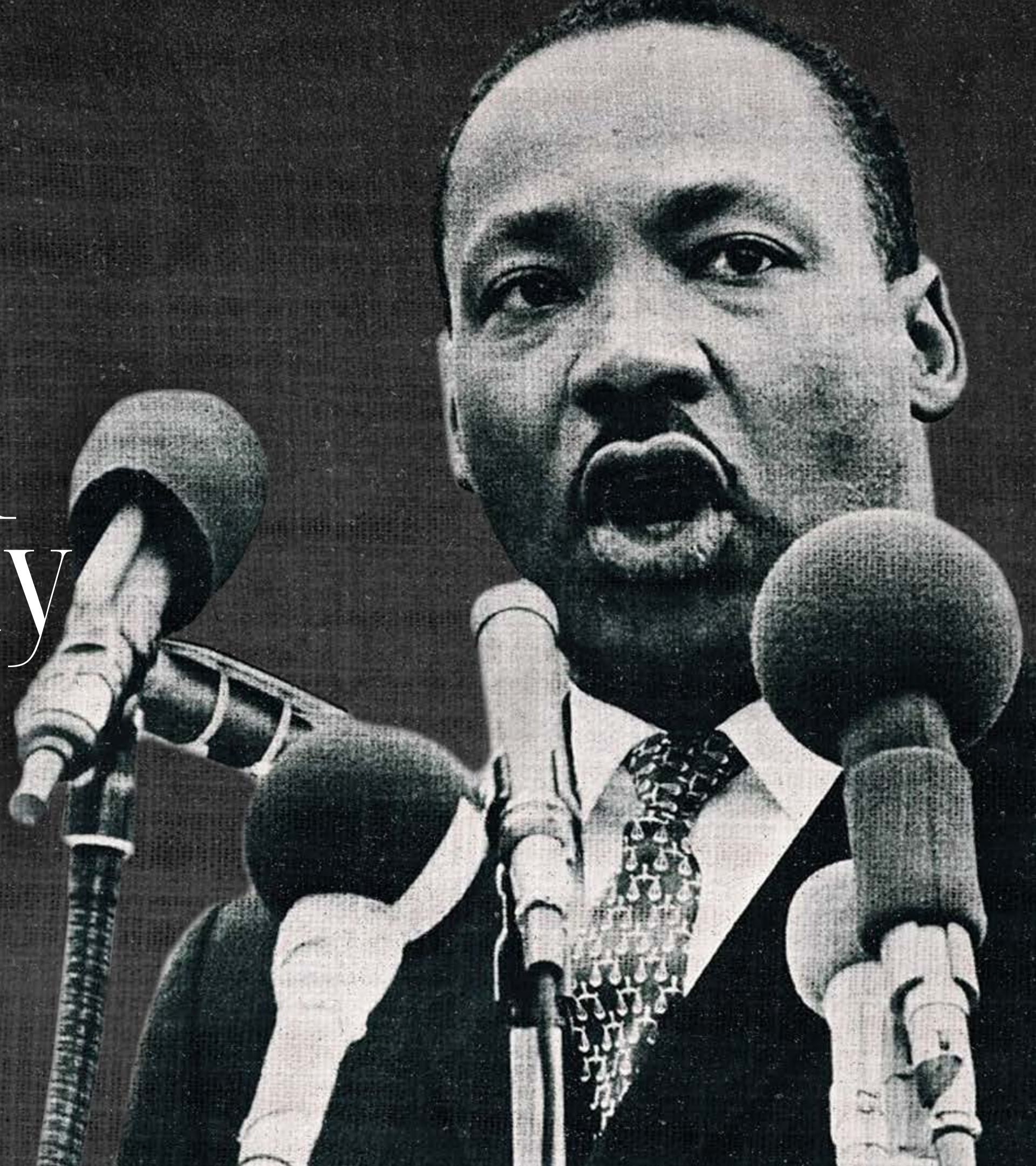

Unforeseen circumstances in life such as layoffs, illnesses, mental disorders, divorce, and even a pandemic are just a few of the reasons people seek assistance from the Ben Hill UMC Food Bank. The majority of our clients are families with children. We typically serve 800 families, which is approximately 2,500 individuals, and 9,000 pounds of food each month.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, our distribution of food changed to meet the needs of the community and also to keep everyone safe and healthy. Therefore, we created a drive-through Pantry. The Ben Hill Food Bank is blessed to have more than 60 people on the Volunteer Register and we give thanks for each and every one of them for their faithfulness and willingness to serve.

The Ben Hill United Methodist Church Outreach Ministry strives to identify and serve the needs of our local community while sharing the love of Jesus Christ. The Ministry provides programs and services throughout the year and partners with several ministries within Ben Hill, other churches, and organizations in the community to assist with education, nutrition, resources, and support for activities that promote Godly relationships in order to meet the social and economic needs of children and families in our community.

The Outreach Ministry has partnered with the Ben Hill Food Bank and other organizations to meet the growing needs of our community during the Covid-19 Pandemic. Although the Church has been closed for in-person worship, Outreach has continued to provide services and resources. A few of the programs that were sponsored by Outreach Ministry in 2020 included Trinity Feeding, Back to School Book Bag Drive, The Annual Touching Hearts with Acts of Love Thanksgiving Outreach Program, and the Annual Adopt-A-Family Program.

The Health & Wellness Ministry continues its mission of providing educational information and resources on key health conditions and their effects on communities of color. The ministry distributes information to increase awareness on a number of health topics, including diabetes, pre-diabetes, immunizations, breast cancer, men's health and autism.

With the declaration of the global health emergency, the Health & Wellness Ministry performed 918 COVID-19 tests in 2020, in partnership with CORE and the Fulton County Board of Health. In collaboration with other Ben Hill ministries, we assisted with voter registration, Census 2020, and extended our outreach to businesses and community agencies. Each of these partnerships shares the goal of reaching out further to connect our Church with the community, per our Vision Statement.

In 2021, we will continue God's work by providing monthly COVID-19 testing to keep our Church family and community healthy.
