2: Put an AirTag in your bag / luggage / purse

Placing an AirTag in your bag, backpack, luggage, or purse, will not only help you find it if you happen to misplace it, but if you leave a bag behind in a taxi, or your purse gets stolen, you'll be able to see where it is which may help the recovery.

3: Place an AirTag in your Wallet

If you carry a wallet, putting an AirTag in there can help you track it down if you ever lose it.

4: Find Your TV Remote

If you constantly lose your TV remote, stick an AirTag on the back of it, and you'll be able to find it right away, and make it play a sound to track it down too.

5: Put an AirTag on your Bike

Hide an AirTag somewhere on your Bike, perhaps under the bike seat, and you'll be able to track it down if it goes missing, or gets stolen.

6: Keep an AirTag in your Car

Having an AirTag on hand in your car is useful for many reasons where you might want to deploy a tracker while you're out and about, but also if you have the AirTag setup and your car happens to get stolen, it will be easier to find.
