- ☐ Cleveland Metroparks Zoo A child-friendly park featuring a 183-acre zoo. Free on most Mondays to residents of Cuyahoga County. We love the annual Asian Lantern Festival! 
- ☐ The Cleveland Metroparks Come to enjoy a family walk, hike, or picnic. Take part in one of the many family/children's activities/camps. Visit one of the playgrounds or nature education centers, including four of our favorites: 
- ☐ Lake Erie Nature & Science Center Offers interactive experiences w/ animals, plus a planetarium & programs/camps for kids.
- ☐ Rocky River Nature Center Offers wildlife exhibits, a river observation deck & a bird-feeding station. 
- ☐ Nature Center At Shaker Lakes Offers wonderful nature experiences and discovery for all ages throughout all seasons. Features an outdoor adventure camp for children preschool-grade 9.
- ☐ Canalway Center Features a canal boat play area, a bird viewing room, and live animal wildlife species in a children's Nature Nook.
- ☐ Cleveland Children's Museum The Children's Museum of Cleveland promotes the power of learning through play using innovative exhibits and programs designed for children birth to age 8. 
- ☐ Local Playgrounds We love our local playgrounds! Here are some of our favorites:
Lindsey Family Play Space at Edgewater Park (Cleveland), Preston's HOPE (Beachwood), James Day (Parma), Highland Heights Community Park (Highland Hts), Clague Park Playground (Westlake), Lyndhurst Community Park Playground (Lyndhurst), Castletown Playground (Strongsville), Lakewood Park (Lakewood), Parkview Playground (Mayfield). 
- ☐ Cuyahoga County Public Libraries We love our local libraries! Cuyahoga County Public Library has 27 branches that serve 47 communities in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. It is among the top library systems in the United States, with fantastic, free programming for children.
