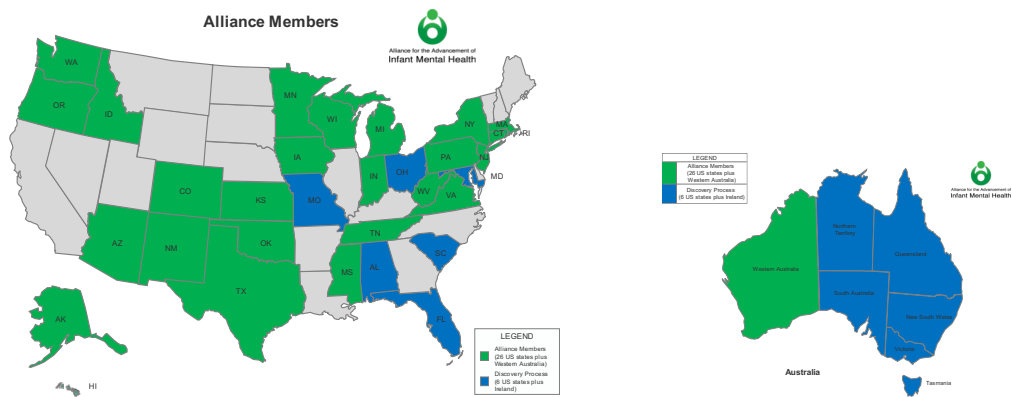

- *1st Annual Reflective Supervision and Consultation Symposium, co-hosted by the Alliance and the Michigan Association for Infant Mental Health in Ann Arbor, Michigan with over 110 in attendance
- *Development of the Endorsement® criteria for professionals across systems working with children 3 up to 6 years and their families
- *Translation of the Competency Guidelines® and Endorsement® materials into Spanish with support from the Oregon Infant Mental Health Association, the Ford Family Foundation, and Colorado Association for Infant Mental Health
