## Fight for \$15--

## and fight for the developmental disabilities community too! Support SB543/HB 664

- → Increases the minimum wage to \$15/hr by 2023
- → Also increases funding for DD community supports as the minimum wage increases, so that direct support jobs don't become minimum wage jobs!

## Why does this matter?

- ~Developmental disability services rely on funding provided by the State Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) combined with federal Medicaid matching funds.
- ~DD services are vital to the 24,000 Marylanders who receive them, providing supports that range from personal care to job coaching.
- ~DD supports also enable families to work and remain economically selfsufficient.

- ~Unlike other businesses, DDA-licensed providers are not able to pass a cost increase on to people who receive supports.
- ~Without an increase for DD community services as the minimum wage increases, the starting wage for direct support

staff will drop below the state minimum wage within 1 year!

SB543/HB664, with Sen. Rich Madaleno and Del. Shelly Hettleman as lead sponsors, is the *only* minimum wage bill to address the critical need for funding for DD services.

- ~Community service providers are required by law to protect the health and safety of the people with disabilities they support.
  - ~Without community supports, the only alternative is more costly and segregated state institutions.
