Hearing 2/8 at 12:30 PM EMC		The Fight for 15 bill aims to raise the state minimum wage to \$15 by 2024 and contains language to provide a 7% rate increase to Community Providers supporting individuals with developmental disabilities in FY20, followed by 5.5% in FY21, 5.5% in FY22, 5.5% FY23, and what amounts to 6.6% in FY24. The bill also includes language for a continuing increase in the state minimum wage and DD funding on years beyond FY24. The DD Coalition is currently working on strategy and messaging around the bill; supporting the move to increase the statewide minimum wage, but addressing the timing and funding on the increases.	As per the bill, the increases to the minimum wage would begin in July 2020. Even though the bill calls for a 7% increase to DD providers in 2020, the governor's proposed budget currently contains a 3.5% increase to providers, representing a gap of 3.5%. We are talking to our representatives to determine best remedies.
