Bryan Gruley: Author Event

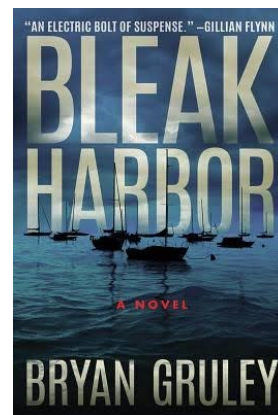
Pulitzer Prize winning author at the library!

To access Brainfuse, simply click on the Database icon on the library's homepage and scroll down to Brainfuse. Before using some of the features, you will be prompted to create a new account. Once you have done so, you can log in to Brainfuse any-time, anywhere. It's that simple!

Brainfuse is an online database that Commerce Township residents can access from virtually any computer with Internet access. This database offers real time tutor services, a 24/7 help center, and includes lessons on a variety of skills, and practice tests for both children and adults. 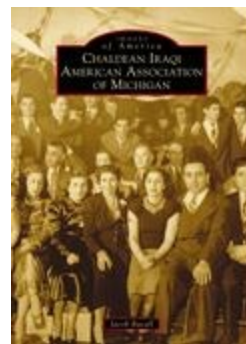
Saturday, November 3, 2018 12 pm - 4:30 PM

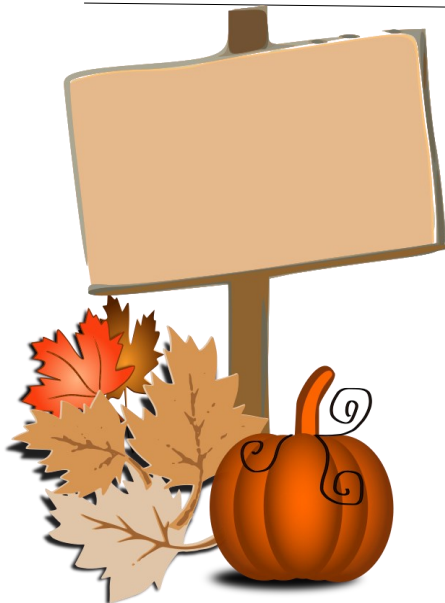

Just log into your library account at commercelibrary.info, select "Account Summary", then "Opt-In & Notifications." Check the box next to "Save my loan history" to enable this convenient feature.

Lightbrary is coming back!

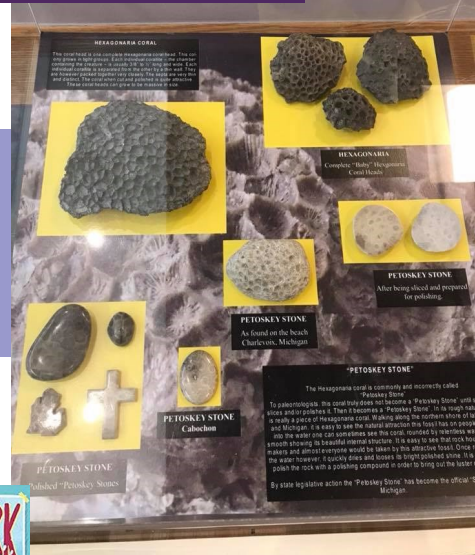
