Think Big Foundation Leads the Pack in Diverting Reusable Clothing From Landfill

As noted in the last newsletter, the EPA reports that the average person discards 70 lbs. of clothing per year. 85% of these materials wind-up in landfills or incinerators, with only a scant 15% entering the recycling stream. Fortunately, in recent years the U.S. has seen a shift in overall recycling activity due to a greater understanding of the impact we are having on the environment. However, it is not commonly understood that nearly every kind of textile has some kind of recycling value as long as it's clean, dry, and free from contamination. The opportunity to engage the community in campaigns to recycle textiles for reuse has never been better. The Think Big Foundation plays an important role in these efforts – through the regular collection of clothing from 54 drop off bins in the Springfield area, area clothing drives, and other initiatives. The Think Big Foundation is non-profit organization and 100% of its proceeds go to Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Ozarks.
