Dear Church Friends,

Last month, the Church Council traveled to the Collins Retreat Center near Estacada for the better part of a day. It was our first in-person Church Council gathering in well over a year. Rather than meet at the church, we went away to have “space” to dream about and discuss the future of our church. We were also working together to formulate 2023 goals for TUMC. It was a fantastic day, from great conversations to the excellent lunch we were blessed to share.

We started our day with a very basic, simple question. Why?

Before we talked about the church, we reflected on this question personally. What is our personal “why”? What’s our purpose? What do we value most deeply? What shapes our choices and direction in life? People shared about serving others, about the importance of community and belonging, and about following Jesus.

What about you? What is your “why”?

That was just the intro! We then talked about our church. **What is TUMC’s “why”?** **Why does our church exist?** What is its purpose? What difference does it make? It might seem like the answers to those questions are obvious, but not always. And as we emerge from the pandemic, which has impacted almost every aspect of people’s lives, it’s important to be clear about our purpose as a church. It may have changed!

Simon Sinek, in a well-known TED talk from about 15 years ago, makes the point that “people don’t buy what you do, but why you do it.” That’s language from the business world, but in this case, it resonates with the church, too. What’s most compelling to people is the “why” underneath the “what.”

Imagine someone saying to you, “Tell me about your church.” What would you say? You could respond by saying, “Well, we worship on Sunday morning at 9:30 a.m. and we have a choir. The men’s group gets together on Tuesday mornings to drink coffee and a women’s group gathers on Wednesday morning. We have a youth group that meets on Sunday afternoons.” Responses like that say what we do and, honestly, are a little boring. Even if you say, “We have a great food pantry that shares food with hundreds of families of every month,” it might be more interesting. But still, it is what we do.

Now imagine someone says, “Tell me about your church.” And instead of giving the person a list of what we do, you instead say, “My church is amazing. We really believe that every person is a beloved child of God. And we want everyone that connects with our church to experience that blessing and belovedness. It’s why we share food with people. It’s why we gather together in groups to support and encourage one another. It’s why we worship together. And it’s why we try to be an inclusive congregation that welcomes everyone – because we want every person who interacts with our church to know that they are a beloved child of God.” I’m willing to bet that the person who asked the question will be intrigued and will want to find out more about TUMC!

So, before drafting goals for 2023, our Church Council reconnected with our church’s “why,” so that what we do is deeply rooted in our understanding of God’s purpose for us, God’s unique call to our congregation.

You can read more about some of the goals the Church Council drafted in the stewardship letter sent out the week of October 24. And more information will come as we enter 2023.

October was a fun month for our TUMC youth. Perhaps the best part of the month was our participation in **Live Action Clue**, a live version of the popular board game.

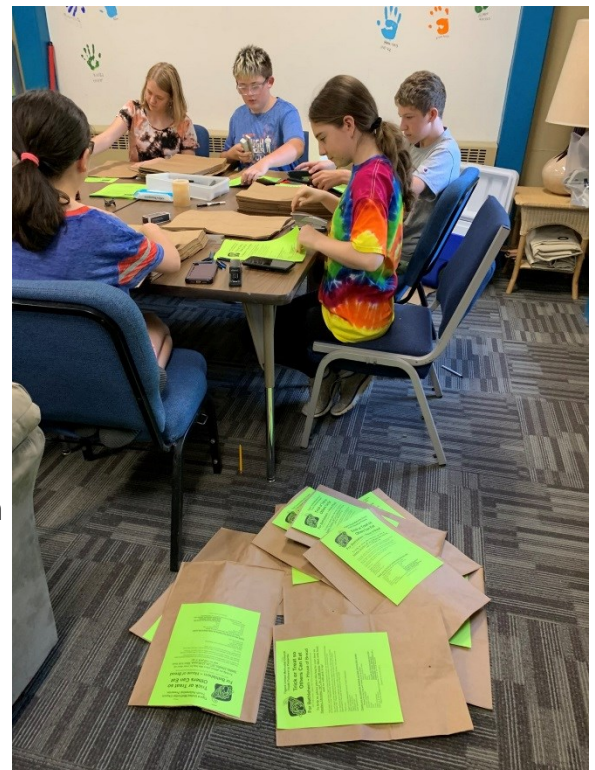
Clue was the first in-person regional youth event in over 2 ½ years. The event was held at Salmon Creek United Methodist Church and over 60 youth from 10 different churches attended. One of the values of this kind of event is that youth can see that there are lots of people their age that are connected to a

local church. This event was also a great opportunity for youth to bring their friends. We had 14 youth from TUMC attend. We look forward to next year and potentially hosting the event in Tigard.

We closed out the month with the youth group sponsored food drive, **“Trick or Treat So Others Can Eat.”** Youth put out more than 300 empty shopping bags on the doorsteps of our Tigard neighbors and picked them up on Sunday October 30th with all collected canned goods going to support the ministry at Bethlehem House of Bread.

When I gathered the TUMC youth for the first time in February, I asked them what some of the youth group traditions were. Most of the youth lifted up the food drive as their favorite event of the year. I have learned that one of the values of Tigard UMC is living out of our faith through service. I am glad that lesson has been instilled in our youth and that we can further it with projects like the fall food drive.

In November youth group will meet on Nov 6, 13, and 27th. No Youth group on Nov 20th. We are also scheduled to volunteer at Nightstrike on Tuesday Nov 10th.

Helping Our Neighbors Fund

The Helping Our Neighbors Fund was created as a way for our congregation to reach out and assist neighbors struggling to pay their rent or utilities in these challenging pandemic years. TUMC gave more than \$50,000 of help during 2020/21, all from congregational donations. Some may be surprised to know that the fund continues to help those in need, on a smaller scale. In the past few months we have helped folks get their power turned back on and assisted multiple households with rent (from \$500 to as little as \$28).

Most referrals come from the Family Partnership Advocates at our local schools. Through this relationship, we hear the stories of the families we help. More than once we have helped a family with parents sick with COVID where their job did not provide sick leave. Our contribution helped them stay current with rent. Another family had a parent fleeing a domestic violence situation and our help, combined with other community partners, helped them into a safer living situation.

If you would like to be a part of this important work and make a tangible difference in the lives of people in our community, donations to the Helping Our Neighbors Fund are always welcome.
