



Winners 2021 RORC Season's Points Championship:

Tom Kneen's JPK 1180 (GBR) - 2021 RORC Season's Championship – Overall Winner

Jazz Trophy for winning the Season's Points Championship - IRC Overall
Somerset Memorial Trophy for the Yacht of the Year

Sunrise: overall wins under IRC in: East Coast Race, the Morgan Cup and the first British skipper to win the Rolex Fastnet Race since 2003, winning the RORC Season's Points Championship by 133 points and taking the biggest haul of prizes ever in the 21-year history of the world's largest offshore championship! The Assuage Trophy for RORC Members and accompanying Assuage Tankard for Morgan Cup; Serendip Trophy for Best Series produced yacht; Emily Verger Plate for winning first place in IRC Two and the Peter Harrison Youth Trophy for IRC yacht with a minimum of 33% of the crew under the age of 25.

Special Awards & Trophies:

Duncan Munro Kerr Youth Challenge Trophy

George Kennedy, onboard both Tala and Sunrise - For youth crew member completing the most miles in top three of class. Kennedy, 21 from Poole, raced with Sunrise and Tala, described winning the Rolex Fastnet Race on Sunrise as a "dream come true".

Keith Ludlow Trophy - Awarded to the navigator of the yacht winning IRC Overall

Best Sailing School (David Fayle Memorial Cup):

Sailing Logic's First 40 Arthur

This is the 14th time a Sailing Logic boat has won the Best Sailing School category. This crew put together a superb campaign this season, with six races including finishing the 2021 Rolex Fastnet Race after retiring in 2019.

Best Overseas Yacht:

Sailed by the French team of Renaud Courbon & Emmanuel Winsback, Shortgood (First Class 10), was one of the smallest boats to race this year. This boat competed in six races, an outstanding effort especially with travel restriction issues. Winning the Stradivarius Trophy for Best Overseas Yacht and coming 3rd Place in IRC Four in the Season's Points Championship.

Alan Paul Trophy for Consistent High Performance:

Ross Applebey's Oyster 48, Scarlet Oyster

Applebey's team came top 5 in class for all 8 races with the RORC including class wins in the De Guingand Bowl, Channel Race and Castle Rock Race – and 2nd place for the Rolex Fastnet Race in IRC Two. This boat takes 3rd Place in IRC Two, 3rd Overall in the Season's Points Championship and is therefore awarded the trophy for consistent high performance

Dillon Perpetual Ladies Trophy:

For top crew containing 30% females - Peter Hopps' Sigma 38 – Sam

Beken Trophy for Concours d'Elegance for a brilliantly turned out classic:

Stormvogel, Stadt 74 Custom - Greenwater Marine Ltd

This cold moulded, wooden yacht - the Rambler of its day - in 60th anniversary of her original race - the 1961 Fastnet, taking Line Honours Transpac, Sydney Hobart, South China Sea Race, Middle Sea Race and the Fastnet - no other yacht has done that!

Dennis P Miller Memorial Trophy, awarded for Best British Yacht Overseas:

Pip Hare on her IMOCA 60, Medallia

Pip has sailed thousands of miles, including two Mini-Transats and one Transat Jacques Vabre - but a huge result in the Vendee Globe saw her become the first British sailor to finish - and in one of the oldest boats in the race.

Best Swan:

Arambalza Swan Cup for best Swan - Jonathan Roll's Swan 38 S/R, Xara

(Racing with family and friends, winning for the second year in a row, Johnathan Rolls classic Swan 38 won the De Guingand Bowl Race overall)

The Freddie Morgan Trophy for Best Classic Yacht in IRC:

Morning After, Stuart Greenfield's S&S 34

Sistership of British PM Ted Heath's 'Morning Cloud', lovingly restored by her new guardian, this boat competed in seven races this year. Also winning 5th place in IRC Four
