Reflections on the Weekend Scriptures

Acts 1:1-11 / Ephesians 1:17-23 / Luke 24:46-53

- We hear it in the first reading, then again in the Gospel: we are called to be witnesses. To be a disciple of Jesus is to both be a witness and to bear witness. We have a model for this calling: Jesus himself. Jesus is his Father's witness and it is thanks to him that we know the Father: "If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him. . . . Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (John 14:7-9). In what Jesus said and what he did, he gradually revealed the Father. May what we say and what we do reveal our faith, our Savior, and in turn, God.
- In each option for the second reading, the author speaks of our hearts directing us to the Lord. The letter to the Ephesians, most likely written by someone writing in Paul's name, calls for "the eyes of your hearts" to be enlightened and so lead us to follow Jesus' call (Ephesians 1:18). In Hebrews, we are invited into the sanctuary, that is, into God's presence, with sincere hearts "sprinkled clean from an evil conscience" (Hebrews 10:22). In ancient times, the heart was thought of as the core of our being and the location of our will. Recall that the psalmist, for instance, cautioned us of hardening our hearts, of resisting the tender care of God. When Jesus left the earth, he left us a new world, one in which our hearts have been purified by the blood of Christ—by his sacrifice on the cross—and now able to be offered to our redeemer.
- Unlike the apostles, we do not have to wait to accept the Christian mission. In both the first reading and the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples to wait until they are baptized with the Holy Spirit. We have already been baptized with the Holy Spirit, so we can carry out our mission anytime. In the Holy Spirit we have received wisdom and guidance and courage, though we may not be aware of each all the time. But these gifts of the Holy Spirit can help us discern what we should do and give us the power and persistence to do it in the face of discomfort or opposition.


