### **BWC PIP**

This opportunity funds law enforcement agencies seeking to pilot, establish, or enhance body-worn camera programs.

**Eligibility:** Public agencies of state government, units of local government, and federally recognized Indian tribal governments.

**Awards:** Up to \$18,000,000 is available in total funding. BWC PIP requires a dollar-for-dollar match in local contributions. This means an agency that applies for \$100,000 in grant funds will have to provide a minimum of \$100,000 in matching funds – thus creating a \$200,000 project.

**Eligible expenses include (but are not limited to):** body-worn cameras, accompanying hardware (e.g. charging stations, lapel clips), accompanying software (e.g. video management systems), officer training, community outreach, and BWC policy development. Eligible applicants may spend up to \$4,000 per camera (\$2,000 grant + \$2,000 local match).

**Project period:** Proposals are due June 5, 2019. Awards will be announced on October 1, 2019
