Impact Numbers

Intakes: 286 animals

Spring and early summer are our busiest months of the year, and Quarter 2 saw a significant increase in the number of animals arriving at the Humane Society of Lebanon County. During this time, we cared for sick, injured, stray, and abandoned animals from throughout Lebanon County, with kitten season bringing a dramatic surge in feline admissions.

Each kitten, puppy, dog, and cat that enters our shelter receives medical care, daily enrichment, nutritious food, and compassionate attention while they wait for a second chance. The increase in kitten intakes highlights the importance of spaying and neutering pets to help reduce the number of homeless animals in our community.

Every intake number represents an animal in need—and because of the generosity of our supporters, we're able to provide them with the care, safety, and hope they deserve.

Reunited with Owner: 44

At the Humane Society of Lebanon County, our first and foremost goal is always reunification. Every stray animal that comes through our doors is someone's beloved pet, and we are committed to doing everything we can to help them find their way home.

During Quarter 2, we were thrilled to reunite 44 animals with their families. These happy endings are some of the most rewarding moments we experience and are made possible through diligent efforts by our staff, community partnerships, and responsible pet owners. One of the easiest ways to increase the chances of a lost pet returning home is to ensure they wear a collar with a current ID tag and have a registered microchip with up-to-date contact information. These simple steps can make all the difference, allowing pets to be identified quickly and reunited with the people who love them.

Thank you for helping us keep pets safe and families together.

Adoptions: 143

Every adoption is more than just a number—it's a life changed forever.

During Quarter 2, 143 animals found loving homes through the Humane Society of Lebanon County. Each adoption opened the door to a brighter future, giving a deserving pet the chance to experience the love, comfort, and security of a family while also creating space for another animal in need to enter our shelter.

Why Field Trips Matter...

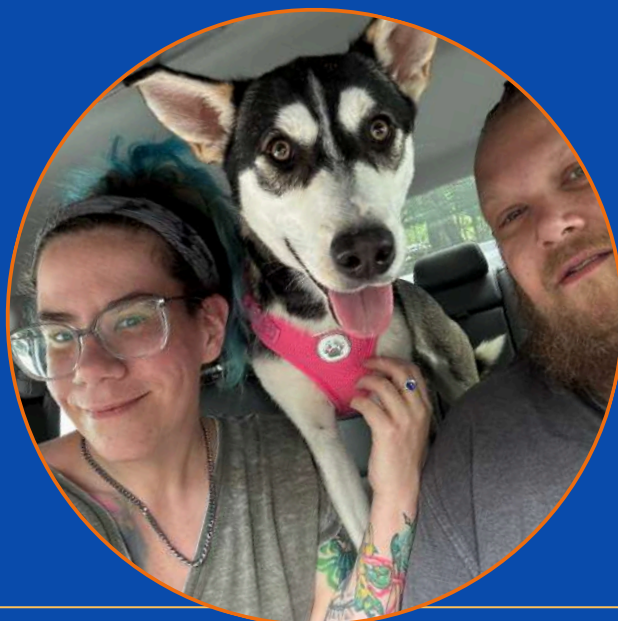
When a dog leaves the shelter, even for a few hours, their entire world opens up. The constant noise and stress of kennel life fade away, allowing their true personality to shine. Many dogs who seem anxious or withdrawn in the shelter transform into relaxed, affectionate companions once they're out in the real world.

Here's why these outings are so important even when they have to come back:

- Stress relief: Time away from the shelter lowers anxiety and improves overall well-being.
- Better behavior insights: We learn how dogs act in homes, cars, and public spaces—helping us make better adoption matches.
- Increased adoption chances: Dogs with field trip photos and stories get more attention and interest.
- Socialization: Exposure to new people, places, and experiences builds confidence.
- A mental reset: Even a short break can make a big difference in a dog's mood and outlook.

Field trips also give our community a chance to connect with these amazing dogs outside of the shelter environment—and often, that's when the magic happens

HOW HOT IS TOO HOT? ☀



AIR	CONCRETE	ASPHALT
85°	→ 105°	→ 130°
91°	→ 125°	→ 140°
97°	→ 145°	→ 150°

ASPHALT TEST:
Press the back of your hand firmly against the asphalt for 7 seconds. If it's too hot for you, then it's too hot for your pet.

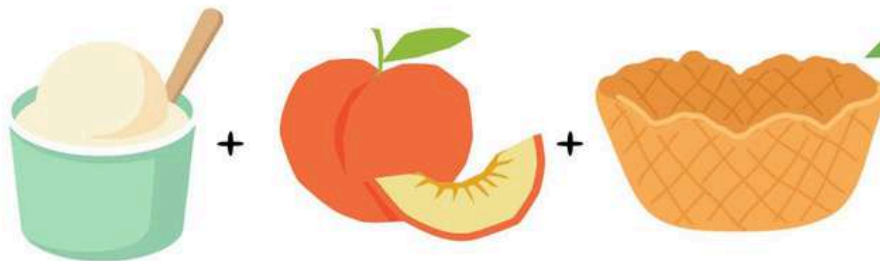
