## Water and Wheel Chairs, Making a Difference



### Upgraded Water System at VS-4

Finally, and with the support from our partner, VietDreams, the 125 children and caregivers will have a new system to meet the needs for laundry, toilettes, and general maintenance. This system includes: ground water collection tank, pump house on high ground, two 5,000 liter holding tanks, and a plumbing system to distribute the water. Funded by FVSO, the construction management was the work of VietDreams, the experts in water systems.



### Free Wheel Chairs for Sao Mai

The Wheelchair Foundation from Danville, CA, distributes wheel chairs to the disadvantaged in 3<sup>rd</sup> world countries. This year, they visited Vietnam and partnered with FVSO to deliver 4 wheel chairs to the disabled children at Sao Mai orphanage. Eight chairs also went to our students at the Don Bosco Trade School.

**From the Foundation:** Our Wheel chairs are custom built, ordered and shipped in bulk to different areas of the world. We collaborate with foreign entities to coordinate local, domestic distribution as specified by our donors (at a cost of \$16,500 to \$42,000 depending upon quantity). Our Mission: The Wheelchair Foundation is a nonprofit organization leading an international effort to create awareness of the needs and abilities of people with physical disabilities, to promote the joy of giving, create global friendship, and to deliver a wheelchair to every child, teen and adult in the world who needs one, but cannot afford one. For these people, the Wheelchair Foundation delivers Hope, Mobility and Freedom.

### The silent sacrifice and the modest fruit of service

Ms. Bil was born in 1950 and passed away on November 25, 2019. She was 69 years old. As a member of the Rongao ethnic minority, she grew up in Kon Monei Kotu village of Kontum town. She is the second daughter of the six children in her family. Her parents passed away when she was still young, which may have led to her becoming a Catholic nun of the Immaculate Miraculous Medal Congregation in 1970. However, in 1994, Sister Bil left that congregation to be a laywoman, eventually becoming a caregiver and teacher at Vinh Son 1.

Ms Bil had a lot of silent sacrifices to love and help the orphans. She wished she could do something to improve the spirit life of the poor ethnic minority orphans and to give them some good experiences that she had in her life. She wanted all the children of Vinh Son 1 to become good citizens for the country and society.

Apart from teaching, she was very eager and enthusiast to practice singing with the children. Although her daily work was very hard, she always had a beautiful smile on her lips because she loved the orphans and her daily work. She felt she could find the happiness in her work to help the orphans and the children's happiness is really her own.

Ms Bil worked at Vinh Son 1 for twenty-five years. She was glad and happy in her classes and she reminded the children to obey the disciplines during the time of their studies. Thanks to her charity and her love, most of the children considered her as their own mother and they loved her very much. Ms Bil considered the children to be her own lovely family. She sacrificed her life to help the orphans with her silent and modest life. With much effort, she taught Vietnamese, English and Bahnar languages so that the children could be successful in school. The children will miss her. We all will.

Dear Friends,

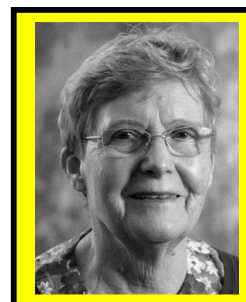
After almost 18 years supporting the orphans at the Vinh Son Orphanages, we have to take the sad decision to finish our Foundation on December 20, 2019.
