## Rules

1. Walkers may start collecting pledges as soon as they receive the pledge sheets. **Reminder: Pledge sheets should be turned in on Walk/Run day, Saturday, September 21, 2019**
3. Pledges may be made by anyone. **Please ask sponsors if their company has a matching gift fund policy.**
4. **Each sponsor making a pledge should write their own name and pledge.** Walkers should collect the pledge in advance but may keep pledges and pledge form until all are collected.
5. On the day of the event, participants will walk starting at 11:00 am on our 5K route. Registration starts at **10:00 am** at the **Greeley Park Bandshell** on **Saturday, September 21, 2019**
6. At registration, volunteers will accept Pledge Sheets and monetary donations. Walkers are requested to collect outstanding pledges - **Please return outstanding pledge sheets with the money to The Task Force (77 Northeastern Blvd. Nashua, NH 03062) by Friday, October 4, 2019**
7. For the safety of our Walkers, bicycling is not permitted. Rollerblading is allowed. Participants are encouraged to wear hats and sunscreen if it's sunny, or bring rain gear if it's rainy. ### Who is Thomas O. Cash?



Tom was such an integral part of the Southern NH HIV/AIDS Task Force: as a client, an HIV/AIDS advocate and public figure, and as the agency front desk volunteer receptionist, a role that earned him the Task Force's Volunteer of the Year Award in 2006. On September 15, 2007, Tom came out in the pouring rain with his Mom and sister to participate in The Nashua HIV/AIDS Walk. He was in a wheelchair and very ill, but he refused to miss a single opportunity to be with his Task Force family. He died on November 1, 2007 of AIDS related complications and liver failure. In 2008, the Nashua HIV/AIDS Walk was renamed the Thomas O. Cash HIV/AIDS Walk to celebrate his life and his dedication to the Task Force. A quote by Kahlil Gibran best summarizes who Tom was and why the walk-a-thon bears his name: *"There are those who have little and give it all. These are the believers in life and the bounty of life and their coffers are never empty."*
