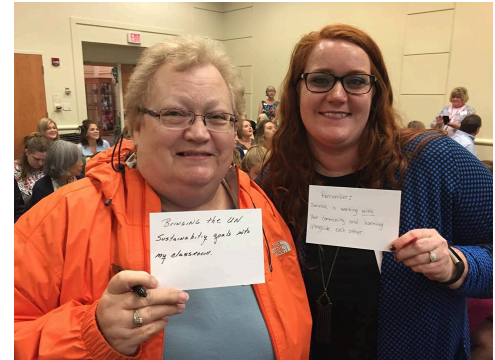


Are YOU a World-Ready Educator? (continued)
