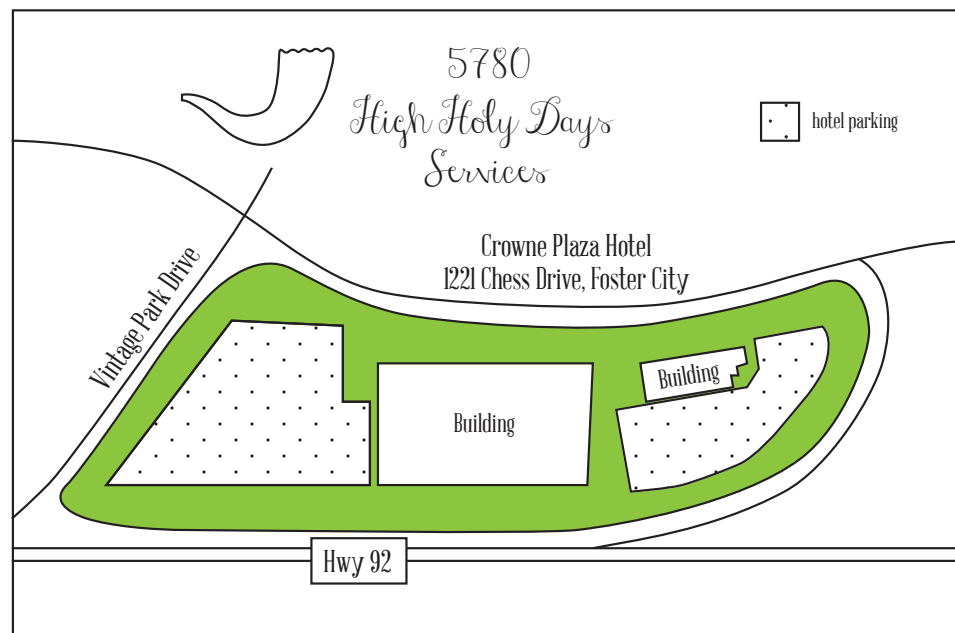

Important Ticket Information

TICKETS ARE NON-TRANSFERABLE

This year our services are being held off-site, at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Foster City. As such, we have different limitations than we do when utilizing temple space. We ask for your patience and compliance with this year's policies, designed both for your safety and to ensure that we have sufficient seating to accommodate Temple members and their families during these Days of Awe.

Please note the information below for participation in this year's services, which may be different than in years past:

YOUR NAMETAGS ARE ENCLOSED IN THIS PACKET

Nametags are this year's tickets and are required for entry into services. In order to be eligible to receive a nametag, you must be a member in good standing. "In good standing" means that all financial obligations for the 2018–2019 fiscal year have been paid in full, you have renewed your membership, and made your first

dues payment for the 2019–2020 fiscal year. Nametags will be issued for all adults, children, and for young adults up to age 26 and must be shown at the entrance to the Ballroom. Nametags will be worn on lanyards, which will be provided as you enter the foyer leading to the Ballroom. Be sure to wear your nametag at all services.

ADDITIONAL NAMETAGS

Due to space limitations and out of respect for our members and their families, we do not sell High Holy Days nametags to nonmembers.

Due to space considerations, there are limited seats available for purchase, as follows:

- Additional High Holy Days nametags are available to members who request them for members' adult children over the age of 26, unaffiliated parents, and other relatives, at \$180 each. Please call the temple office or email kthacker@ptbe.org to request additional nametags. At that time, we will need

names of all guests for whom you are purchasing nametags. We will bill your temple account.

- If you will be hosting out-of-town guest(s) affiliated with a synagogue in their home city, please call the temple office or email kthacker@ptbe.org as soon as possible to request reciprocal High Holy Days ticket(s) at no charge. The reciprocity process takes a minimum of five days to complete.
- If you will be traveling during the High Holy Days and would like to attend services in your destination city, please call the temple office or email pcapocci@ptbe.org as soon as possible so that reciprocal High Holy Days tickets can be requested on your behalf.

Nametags are for temple members and are intended only for the person whose name is on the tag. For your safety and the safety of your family, we will be checking your nametags closely.

Child Care for Children 3 Months to Pre-K Only

Enjoy your early morning service with your school-age children. Child care will be provided at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Foster City only for infants through pre-K during late morning services on both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Registration by **September 13** is required for both sessions; walk-ins will not be accepted. Space is not guaranteed for registrations received after this date. Space is limited. Email apryor@ptbe.org for reservations. Your temple account will be billed.

- Registration fee: \$18/child per session
- Drop off: No earlier than 30 minutes prior to start of service
- Pick up: No later than 15 minutes after end of service

Please provide for all of your child's needs, including diapers, filled bottles, snacks, and drinks. Children will be divided into two groups according to age. Please look for signs pointing you to the Syracuse Room to check in. Please include a brief description of your child's special care requirements in your child's diaper bag and/or discuss them with the teachers upon arrival.

High Holy Days 5780/2019 Important Information

We ask that you read this important information carefully to provide you, our members, with the best worship experience.

1 Access into Services at the Crowne Plaza, Foster City: For security and your ease, we will all enter the Ballroom from the foyer double doors. For the safety of our community and for the speediest entry, please wear your nametag.

2 Nametags: All members in good standing and their family members (aged 26 or younger) will receive a nametag for services. Nametags are non-transferable. "In good standing" means that all financial obligations for the 2018–2019 fiscal year have been paid in full, and you have renewed your membership and made your first dues payment for the 2019–2020 fiscal year. If you lose your nametag, please check in at the Will Call table and a temporary replacement nametag will be issued. If you did not receive the correct number of nametags in this packet, please notify the temple office immediately.

3 Our Two Morning Services: To meet the needs of our growing community there will be two morning services on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Please join us for the one service that will best meet your needs. The Tree of Life Family Service (8 AM) is a multigenerational service designed for families with school-age children. The late service (10:30 AM) serves adults and families with teens. By offering these two worship times, we will have enough room for all of our members to worship more comfortably, enhancing our experience as well. We strongly

encourage families with school-aged children to select the early morning service. Please note: There will not be child care for school-age children.

4 Security: Our community's safety is of primary concern. The side doors in the Ballroom will be used only for exiting from services.

5 Please silence your cell phones when you enter the temple and refrain from texting.

6 Go Scent-Free: You never know who will end up seated next to you, and they may not have a tolerance for strong perfumes or lotions. For some, strong scents can bring on headaches, migraines, or an asthma attack. Please be considerate and come to services scent free.

7 Parking: Since we will be off-site at a public location, there are no special parking permits required this year. The hotel offers a 2-story parking structure on the west side of the building and a smaller parking lot on the east side. Designated accessible parking spaces requiring the disabled placard are limited, but available in both lots. There is also a drop-off point at the front entrance to the hotel.

8 Children at Services and Child Care: Since we are gathering in a public space and not on temple grounds, for their safety, children should be accompanied by an adult when not in services. We ask that noise be kept to a

minimum to protect the sanctity of the day. Please see www.ptbe.org/worship-at-ptbe for tips for praying with kids. A child care program is available for ages three months through pre-K only during the late morning services on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Pre-registration is required and must be received in the temple office by September 13 to guarantee space. Walk-ins will not be accepted. Please email apryor@ptbe.org to reserve your space.

9 Saving Seats: This has been a very delicate issue for us all. We understand that you want to be seated with your family and friends during services, but saving a large number of seats is exclusionary to those members who arrive early. Please plan to arrive early enough so your group can be accommodated to sit together. Our ushers, who are themselves members of our temple community, need your support and understanding about this issue. We will try to accommodate you, but seating a member who is already present must take priority.

10 Book of Remembrance: If you have placed names of your loved ones in the Book of Remembrance and requested for a printed copy, it will be available to be picked up in the foyer prior to the Yizkor Service on Yom Kippur afternoon.
