Four Programs for Four Chaplains.

- 1. The Legion of Honor Program which recognizes selfless service and interfaith/interracial cooperation throughout the nation and now the world, by recognizing ordinary people who do extraordinary things.
- 2. The National Annual Student Scholarship Competition which awards financial scholarships for grades 5 thru 12, based upon competitive entries on the theme of selfless service through either essay, art, YouTube or photography. The details for the 2017-2018 competition are in this newsletter.
- 3. Our reenergized Emergency Chaplains Program which provides Chaplains on an as needed basis to handle crises throughout our nation, and which conducts training for first responder chaplains.
- 4. Our growing outreach to veterans to address the needs of veteran homelessness, joblessness, substance abuse, suicide and PTS. Our symposium in April 2017 on Veteran PTS and suicide was one of the first to be held in the Philadelphia metropolitan area. Another is scheduled for May 2018.

As a member of the special staff of the Chief of Staff, Chaplain Schaick assists the Chief of Chaplains in establishing guidance on all matters pertaining to the religious and moral welfare of Air Force personnel and their dependents and directing and maintaining a trained, equipped and professional Chaplain Corps of more than 2,200 chaplains and chaplain assistants from the active and Air Reserve components. As a

member of the Armed Forces Chaplains Board, he and other members advise the Secretary of Defense and Joint Chiefs of Staff on religious, ethical and quality-of-life concerns.

Chaplain Schaick is a native of Oshkosh, Wisconsin, and enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in 1976 serving four years as an F-15 Integrated Avionics Component Specialist. He was commissioned in the Air Force Reserves as a chaplain candidate in 1985 and into the active duty chaplaincy in 1988. An ordained Presbyterian minister, Chaplain Schaick is endorsed by the Presbyterian Church, USA.

Twilight Wish Foundation, Cass Forkin—Founder



Cass Forkin is both a passionate visionary and a businessperson who gets things done with her "We can do it" Rosie attitude. She was born and raised in Philadelphia and holds "brotherly love" as the key to winning the game of life. Cass received her MBA from LaSalle University in Philadelphia, PA.

In 2002, Forkin anonymously treated seniors in a diner. Their reaction led to Cass founding Twilight Wish Foundation on July 1, 2003, the first national wish granting organization dedicated to serving the needs of the elderly. Today, Cass continues to serve Twilight Wish as the Chairwoman of the Board and national public speaker. Cass started a national movement with just \$711 and a small, but dedicated group of people who believed in the cause. Fourteen years later, Twilight Wish has established 18 chapters

throughout the U.S. and has granted over 2,700 wishes to deserving seniors, including 887 veterans from WWII and Vietnam and inspired a national and international movement. Twilight Wish brought awareness of the senior wish stories to hundreds of millions of people who learned about granting wishes to seniors. This seeded the movement to make our world a nicer place to age, one Twilight Wish at a time. Grassroots efforts to international change on a dime!

Recently, Forkin helped our nation bring honor and recognition to the WWII "Rosie the Riveters" by creating the widespread marketing idea promoting the first National Rosie the Riveter Day.

Since its inception, Twilight Wish grants approximately one wish every other day in our country and has inspired thousands of others to do the same. To honor and enrich the lives of seniors through wish granting celebrations that connect generations and treat the elderly with compassion, we restore their dignity and bring them hope. We also teach the younger generations the importance of respect and caring for those that paved the path for them and spread "brotherly love" throughout the world.
