What is the Veteran Friendly Congregation Ministry?

The Veteran Friendly Congregation Ministry's purpose is twofold. <u>First</u>, to provide a visible sign to those that visit the congregation that they understand and are sympathetic to the needs of veterans and their families. <u>Second</u>, to provide acknowledgement to the congregation and their leaders of their sincere and earnest efforts to support veterans and their families.

Why are Veteran Friendly Congregations Needed today?

Research consistently shows that clergy and congregation leaders, not psychologists or other mental health experts, are where people first seek assistance in times of distress. Eventually they then seek therapy from professional clinicians often with the help of their community of faith.

What is the purpose for having programs and ministries initiated by Congregations?

Each congregation can choose to implement programs/ministries that will qualify your congregation as a Veteran Friendly Congregation. The purpose of these programs is to keep congregation members AWARE of the military and their needs, and to use the programs to create an atmosphere of Acceptance and Recognition throughout congregations.

The Veteran Friendly Congregation Involvement includes four (4) commitments: The congregation agrees to:

- adopt one or more of the Veteran Friendly Congregation suggested programs to implement from the VMFC Handbook.
- communicate the existence of the program (s) at least bi-annually by advertising the existence of the Veteran/Military Ministry Programs in one or more of the congregation's publications (service bulletins, newsletters, etc.) publicly to visitors, members, and leadership of the congregation.
- provide permission to the Veteran Friendly congregation organization to list their congregational information on their website.
- renew the commitment with the provisions above by sending a letter by 15
 November each year to

- 1. The Pastor should introduce the program to the congregational leadership for the Veteran Friendly Congregation Ministry.
- 2. Recruit and Assign (ask for a volunteer) a Lay Ministry Leader if leadership agrees to become a VMFC.
- 3. Sign-up up as a Veteran Friendly Congregation at:

- 4. The Lay Minister then Recruits a "team", "group", or "ministry" to begin the training process.
- 5. The team decides which programs to begin and/or enhance
- 6. Consider being a Lead Congregation and work with the Veteran Friendly Congregation leader ship.
