This past year has been a tough year. As we began the new school year in September, our school receptionist was not able to return due to a serious health issue with her liver. In October, our house manager was diagnosed with cancer. Another house staff person needed to take a leave of absence for health reasons. And our office manager's husband was diagnosed with a brain tumor, which required her to be out with him, off and on, for 4 months. In November, another house staff person needed to take a leave of absence because of a death in her family, and our lead teacher had to resign for personal reasons.

In January, I cried out to God and asked Him to please move the mountain, something I pray often when I hit a hard situation or season, and many times He has moved the mountain. However, this time I heard Him say, "No, I am not going to move this mountain, I want you to climb it." I cried out and said, "But it is too big", and He said "Not if you take one step at a time with Me". He reminded me about the mountain in Hawaii that Ben and I

were climbing last year so we could see a 120-foot waterfall. As we climbed, it began drizzling and the path became slippery, and at times it was very steep. Half way up we stopped to rest, and thought about whether or not we should turn around and go back down. At that time, a couple came walking down the mountain, all wet and muddy, and they encouraged us saying: "Don't stop now, you are half way there and it is worth the effort." So we continued climbing. We took it slow, helping each other and taking breaks. When we got to the top it was BREATH TAKING and we were so glad we had pressed on to get to the top of the mountain! God then spoke to me and said, *"When you need Me to go before you, I will offer you My hand to help pull you up. When you need Me to walk alongside you and encourage you, I will. And when you need Me to walk behind you and gently push you, I will. When you need to sit and rest, I will rest with you. And at times, I will even carry you. But I need you to climb this mountain. I need to strengthen your faith, I need to teach you some things. I need you to see things that you can only see from the top of the mountain, and I promise it will be worth it."*



Lakeland builders donated the rest of the materials to finish the boys home at half price.

A gentleman has donated his time to lay all the flooring to finish boys home.

The boys home will be completed by July.

We have house parents, a resident assistant, intern and counselor for next Fall for boys home and will be ready to welcome a full house in September.

We have had numerous donations of needed items, including toilet paper, sanitizer, beef, furniture, art supplies, and more.

All of the staff with health issues are healing and doing well now.

Donations continue to come in despite the uncertainty of the economy. Our heart was touched by an 8 yo who made bookmarks with positive messages, then she donated to Agape the \$410 people gave her!

A past student made Agape House the benefactor of her senior project and collected almost \$1,000.00, as well as personal items for the teens.

New timbers were donated to replace the ones that were rotting at the boys home.

And in the midst of not having our full staff present, we have still been able to keep the doors open and serve four girls and two boys in our program, while staying in touch with those at home, including offering counseling services.

This is just a sampling of how our faith is being strengthened and we are filled with joy!
