THE CHILDREN'S WORLD FAIR - CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS

The Children's World's Fair is a celebration of culture that gives children and their families a chance to travel the world in one day within the Louisiana Children's Museum on Julia Street. Every year different cultural exhibits highlighting nations from around the globe are created. These exhibits feature crafts, activities, food, entertainment, STEM experiments, and more. This is the 21st year of the event and the final year on Julia Street. The eight countries featured are Canada, China, Colombia, Denmark, France, Ireland, the Philippines, and Senegal.

Volunteers are needed to help plan, create, set-up, and deliver the nation exhibits for the big day. Below are the ways that volunteer help is needed:

Friday, March 22 (any time between 12pm-7pm) – Helping the France committee set up their exhibit (lots of moving and setting up required)

Saturday, March 23 (8:30am-5:30pm = All day Volunteers; OR Morning Shift Volunteers = 8:30am-1:30pm; Afternoon Shift Volunteers = 1:00-5:30pm) – Volunteers will help lead activities, crafts, serve food, etc. within exhibits at the Children's World's Fair event for the children and families visiting the Museum that day. Volunteers will also help with some set-up that morning and with some pick-up/clean-up when the event ends.

Pizza and water bottles are provided for all day volunteers and March 23rd volunteer are encouraged to wear the colors of the flag of the country they are helping with for the day. All France volunteer names (first and last) and the duration of the time they'll be volunteering should be emailed to Amy Kirk no later than **Monday, February 18th** so she can send that list to me.
