Students who attend school in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas, grades K-12, may submit a poem or work of art that addresses one of the grade level prompts below:

K thru 8th – Your house is always connected to electricity. Just a flip of the switch brings that power into your home. Write a poem or create a depiction: 1) Telling how you used your power to help someone who was being bullied. 2) Portraying how being that for someone made you feel.

Describe a time when you were the “light switch” to bring your power to a situation where someone was being treated unfairly because of biases. Write a poem or create a depiction: 1) Telling how you used your power to help someone who was being treated unfairly because of biases. 2) Portraying how being that for someone made you feel.
