

FAITHFUL FUTURE PLANNING UPDATE—JANUARY 2023

On Sunday, January 15, we resumed our FFP Moments to bring people up to date on our Faithful Future Planning work. We had suspended these FFP moments during Advent but we did not suspend our work.



It is helpful to restate the GOAL OF THE FAITHFUL FUTURE PLANNING AD HOC COMMITTEE:

To develop a plan, or set of scenario plans, to identify how East Church can best support its Mission and Vision. With a sense of urgency and opportunity fostered by the pandemic, we will:

- Assess who we are at present: our current active membership, our projected future membership, our current financial assets, our projected assets and liabilities. We will seek input from:
 - Our committees and groups
 - The full church membership
 - The wider church and community
 - And utilize UCC resources
- We will use the results of this assessment process to help define options for our church for the future, living out our Mission and Vision

As we complete 2 years of hard work on this process, you have all heard much about our assessments, about the focus groups on Governance, on Engaging Our Hybrid Congregation, on Building and Property. We soon will be sharing the results of our last focus group, which is Community Conversations.

As we are about to enter this third year of our work, we are engaging a new consultant, Rev. Dr. Claire Bamberg. The FFP Leadership acknowledged that we are at the point where we need some outside help. Claire is the Founder and CEO of Potentials Coaching and Consulting, an ordained UCC minister, licensed mental health professional, certified mediator, and a professional certified coach. She has more than forty years of experience and loves working with congregations like ours that are deeply invested in discerning God's call for our future mission and ministry.

We have been looking IN at WHO WE ARE. We now need to look OUT at WHO IS OUR NEIGHBOR and WHO ARE WE CALLED TO SERVE AND HOW?, in identifying and implementing our next way of carrying out our Mission of "BUILDING AND SERVING COMMUNITY IN CHRIST'S NAME." Rev. Claire has been assisting other UCC congregations across the country in this type of process and is eager to work with East Church. The Leadership and entire FFP team have had meetings with her and unanimously agree she will be an asset for us.
