READING CHANGES LIVES | REQUESTS FOR THE ROOSEVELT

The school library at the Roosevelt K-8 will soon reopen for the first time since the pandemic began in March 2020. A number of volunteers from East Church continue to work to ready the space, the shelves, and most importantly, the books, for Wednesday October 5 when class days return to the library.

- Two critical needs have been identified for the library for this fall:
1. **volunteers** to staff the library every other Wed. from 8:30am to 1:00pm (in one, two, or more hour increments; please see Janice P.)
 2. **funds** to purchase new books (some replacements and some to expand the small, curated collection)

The list of 50 specific books we hope to purchase will cost approximately \$800.00. Most books needed range in price from \$10.00 to \$25.00. Donations of any amount are greatly appreciated. Please be sure to clearly designate your donation for “Roosevelt Library Books” by noting this on the memo line of your check. (And in case you’re wondering, we do have ample books already for Trick-or-Treat for Books, so our one monetary appeal for books this fall is for the Roosevelt.)
