



"We have to show up when it comes to voting"





Environmental Justice Committee

The Clean Energy Alliance of Naperville (CLEAN), the Act Connect Engage (ACE), and the Indivisible Naperville organizations came together on October 5th at the Free Speech Pavilion in Naperville. They rallied in an effort to have the Naperville City Council “stop the complicity, [and] end coal-powered electricity!” Participants rallied because several years ago the “Naperville council leaders signed a multi-year agreement to purchase their electricity from Prairie State Coal.” Naperville cannot take advantage of clean energy incentives because the bills they pay do not go towards them. However, they are paying for the most polluting energy plant in Illinois and seventh most polluting plant in the country. Because pollution has such a negative impact on health, many people including activists, college professors, and pastors spoke at the rally. After the event, participants walked to the Naperville City Council meeting to speak about coal-powered electricity. 

Climate and Equitable Jobs Act

During the month of September the Climate and Equitable Jobs ACT was signed into law by Governor Pritzker in Chicago at the Shedd Aquarium. The environmental justice committee is especially grateful for their local legislators who supported this innovative and groundbreaking law. This bill is the strongest climate bill passed in the nation, establishing Illinois as a leader on climate and generating billions in economic investments in renewable energy. An important aspect of the law is to support communities that are impacted by fossil fuels. Another aspect of this law is that it sets Illinois on the path to 100% clean energy usage by 2050!



The Illinois General Assembly approved maps for Congressional redistricting in the veto session, and they are now awaiting Governor Pritzker's signature. These maps will be the congressional districts for the next 10 years. A new majority Latino district was drawn across the northern proportion of DuPage County. The event, which spans from September 15 to October 15, commemorates how those communities have influenced and contributed to American society at large.”

Fun Facts:

“Hispanic Heritage Month begins on September 15 because that date marks the anniversaries of national independence in several Latin American countries. Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua all celebrate September 15 as their Independence Day. Mexico’s independence as a nation is celebrated on September 16, and Chile’s is celebrated on September 18.”

“It may be surprising to learn how many things in American culture trace back to Hispanic culture. For example, cowboy hats and rodeos originated in Spain and Mexico. Many city and state names like San Antonio, Corpus Christi, Colorado, and Montana come from Spanish words. The name “Texas” comes from “tejas,” the Spanish form of a Native American word.”
