#### From I-93S in Concord:

Take Exit 15 E to I-393 East.

Take Exit 3 to Route 106 and head right onto 106-South.

Proceed 1 mile, past the Steeplegate Mall.

The ABC NH/VT Chapter Office & Education Center is on the right at the corner of Route 106 and Chenell Drive.

#### From I-93N in Concord:

Take Exit 13.

Proceed right onto Route 3-North; Manchester Street.

Move into the left lane and take the first left onto Old Turnpike Road.

Cross over Airport Road and continue on Regional Drive to Route 106.

At the lights, turn right onto Route 106. We are at the next intersection.

The ABC NH/VT Chapter Office & Education Center is on the right at the corner of Route 106 and Chenell Drive.

## From the Seacoast:

Take Route 4-West to I-393 West.

Take the Route 106-South exit on your left.

Proceed 1 mile, past the Steeplegate Mall.

The ABC NH/VT Chapter Office & Education Center is on the right at the corner of Route 106 and Chenell Drive.

## **PARKING:**

Parking and entrance for our **Education Center** is at the **back of the building**.
