



2018 Chateau Haut Peyruguet Rouge (Bordeaux, France)

This wine has been in our line-up since 2005 after the Calvets brought it to my attention on my first buying trip to Bordeaux. It has always been, even in difficult vintages, a lovely and useful bottle of wine. In better vintages it can be one of our best values at around ten bucks. This particular vintage caught my attention in part because, for the first time that I can recall, the wine received a big score from a popular wine critic. So I've taken a couple bottles home, and I have to say, this might be the best vintage ever for this wine. Now don't get me wrong, it is still an every-day bottle of wine. Primarily Merlot (80%), with the balance Cabernet Sauvignon (20%), this wine is grown by the Jolivet family in the southern part of the greater Bordeaux region. A dry red with a very appealing mid-weight palate, this shows lovely balance of soft, old-world fruit and fresh acidity; flavor notes are mulberry, cassis, and blackberry. The wine slides into a classic Bordeaux finish showing earth and leather tones. This is really a typical, in the best possible sense, red Bordeaux for burgers, steak frites, BBQ, and anything off the grill. For ten dollars, I find this an amazing value. (11719)

2019 Berger Gruner Veltliner 'Lossterrassen' (Kremstal, Austria)

Erich Berger is well known in his native land of Austria as a skilled winemaker with a big heart and big personality. We know his work primarily from drinking untold quantities of his Liter bottling of Gruner Veltliner. The Liter bottling has been a top-selling wine of ours here at Surdyk's every year for as long as I can remember. That's the thing here with Berger: the wines, from the top of his range to the bottom, are just always delicious. He's careful, thoughtful, ambitious, and focused on making his wines beautiful and delicious and affordable... every time. Just so with this Lossterrassen bottling. This is his 'mid-range' wine, literally grown on terrasses of loess (which is a soil type found widely in this area) and is as beautiful a white wine as I can recall for anything like this price. The idea that comes to mind when I drink this is purity... just simple, lovely, pure fruit in harmony with acids, and easy to drink and love. Flavor notes for me include pear, white flowers, maybe some honeysuckle and a little white pepper in the background. In some ways it reminds me of the Andriano Pinot Grigio that I recommended last fall. If you liked that wine, you'll like this as well. (106098)

2020 Commanderie de la Bargemone Rosé (Coteaux d'Aix-en-Provence, France)

Back in 1996, "BK" (before kids), my wife and I took a trip to France. One of our favorite stops was in the beautiful University town of Aix-en-Provence in the south, where we fell in love with the local dry rosé wine that was seemingly as essential to everyday life as water. It has been fun to see dry rosé wines emerge in the US as a major category, with examples from wine regions all over the world. However, the rosés of Provence have always brought back fond memories for me, and we recently added a wine to Surdyk's that has at first sip become my absolute favorite rosé, by Commanderie de la Bargemone. Founded by the Templar Knights in the 13th century, the winery has 163 acres of predominately red grape varieties that are certified organic. This rosé is a blend of Grenache (45%), Cinsault (21%), Cabernet Sauvignon (15%), Syrah (13%), and Sauvignon Blanc (6%). The grape varieties are vinified separately in stainless steel tanks with cold fermentation to preserve freshness and natural acidity. The wine shows shimmering, vibrant pink colors, with a beautiful nose of wild strawberries and banana/bubblegum. The mouthfeel is beautifully rich, with fruitiness and weight up front that transitions to a long finish that becomes increasingly dry and focused by acidity and subtle mineral notes. Truly a beautiful wine that sets the standard for Provence rosés. Enjoy your journey to Provence in beautiful southern France; Salut! (116125)

2018 Bodegas Morca 'Flor de Goda' Garnacha (Campo de Borja, Spain)

Spanish wines have always intrigued me for their variety of styles, from simple fruit forward wines to ones that show complexity and old-world elegance. Wines made from the Garnacha (Grenache) grape have perfectly highlighted this dichotomy of style, and fortunately I came across a new (to Surdyk's) wine that perfectly balances elements of both. The wine is Flor de Goda 2018 Garnacha, produced by Bodegas Morca in the Campo de Borja region of northern Spain. Garnacha grapes from low yielding small vineyard plots are hand picked and fermented separately in small vats, and then aged in French oak barrels for 15 months. The color is a mix of cherry red and darker purple black colors. The beguiling nose has gobs of black fruits, licorice, smoke, vanilla, and subtle spice box notes, all of which transfer to the palate. The rich cassis fruitiness slowly gives way to fine grained tannins that provide a drying sensation and help lead to a long, memorable finish. Pair with grilled meats, aged cheese, and my favorite, butterflied leg of lamb marinated with Mediterranean spices and olive oil, then grilled slowly to perfection! The incredible value of this wine will ensure that it will become a staple in your household, so buy accordingly and share with your friends and family. Cheers! (116370)

Summer months seem to be white wine's time to shine. I look for "change-of-pace" whites that offer crispness and refreshing flavors on hot sunny days. Pinot Grigio (Italian label) or Pinot Gris (preferred French description) has all I'm looking for: This wine fits nicely between a bold, fruity Chardonnay and a dry, zippy Sauvignon Blanc by providing a measured, structured flavor, acidity, and crispness. Surdyk's has had Canoe Ridge Expedition Pinot Gris for many years and it is popular with our customers for good taste and value. Fruitiness of honeydew melon with some lemon zest and ripe apple aroma set this wine apart. Really nice balanced acidity for a crisp dry texture. This wine chilled and served with seafood and a cold pasta salad make for a delightful lunch. Canoe Ridge is also a charmed white to pair with creamy chèvre. This American Pinot Gris will become a favorite on your table. Our summer sale is the time to try this tasty bargain-priced white wine. (108385)

2018 Rio Madre Rioja (Rioja, Spain)

Rioja is the best-known wine region in Spain! Red wines from Rioja are really popular at Surdyk's, for value as well as good taste. Rioja red wines are often blended with Tempranillo, Grenache, and Graciano grapes. This Rio Madre 2018 Rioja stands out because it is just one single grape - 100% Graciano. Upon tasting the wine, I found Graciano at its best. Deep rich red color, full aromatic dark red berry flavors, solid acidity, and firm tannic core. In the glass, primary fruit of blackberry and cherry, with good secondary spice notes of black pepper, caramel notes from American oak, and soft cola finish. Try with almost any red meats on your grill. Char and smoke and a glass of Rio Madre will fit right in! (113529)

2018 Steele Pinot Noir (Carneros, CA)

I have long been a fan of Steele wines and its founder/winemaker Jed Steele. For 50 years now, he has earned a reputation for crafting outstanding small-lot, vineyard-designated wines, and this 2018 Steele Pinot Noir is no exception. Although the front label doesn't boast, these grapes come solely from Sangiacomo Vineyards in Carneros, the coolest part of Sonoma County, and have since its first bottling in 1991. It fills a need in our domestic red aisle: exceptionally made, fairly priced, varietally correct Pinot Noir. A beauty in the glass, the nose shows baked cherry, spiced rhubarb, and a hint of savory sundried tomato. The taste delivers ripe black cherry, bright pops of raspberry, along with creamy vanilla notes (from the 12 months it spent in oak). I have tasted several vintages of this lovely wine over the years and have never been disappointed. Now, at 75, Jed is ready to retire. Steele wines will continue on under new ownership, which makes the 2018 Pinot Noir one of the last few vintages made by Jed Steele himself. I, myself, will be buying a case. (14097)

El Maestro Sierra 15 year Oloroso Sherry 375ml (Jerez, Spain)

Spanish sherry has a confusing, even intimidating reputation that keeps many wine lovers from experiencing one of the most delicious food partners around. For those of you who aren't familiar, here's a (very) brief rundown:

Sherry is a fortified wine from Spain. It can be dry or sweet. Three varieties are allowed in production: Palomino for dry wines, Pedro Ximenez and Moscatel for sweet. El Maestro Sierra Oloroso is dry; the term 'Oloroso' indicates the wine was intentionally exposed to oxygen as it matured for 15 years in a solera system (a complex, multi-vintage barrel program). That oxygen exposure is what creates the classic "sherry" flavor profile that elevates many recipes, from soups to sauces, and poultry and beef. The lovely amber color is the first indication that you are in for something special. The nose shows nuttiness, earthiness, and a false hint of sweetness which never comes through on the palate. Instead, the savory side of fig, dried orange, baking chocolate, and roasted nuts linger through its complex finish. The fact that it lacks all of the usual fruit notes found in "traditional" wine is something I crave when I want something a bit different. When chilled and served alongside aged cheeses, olives, meats, and nuts, it's a truly magical (and easy!) combination. (104787)

Barrell Craft Spirits American Vatted Single Malt Whiskey

Over the last several years, the scene for American Single Malt whiskey has gradually picked up steam, moving from the niches of niche, to a burgeoning favorite of enthusiasts and an epicenter for creativity in American whiskey. It's a place where distillers can break free from the rigid requirements surrounding bourbon and other classic American styles, to experiment with cask finishes, aging methods, and terroir. A 'vatted' malt is a blend of multiple single malts from multiple distilleries. In order to assemble a quality vatted malt, there needs to not only be a wide variety of distilleries to choose from, but the distillates themselves need to be of a minimum standard of quality across their range; in a vatted malt, there's less room to hide. The fact that Barrell can produce a quality vatted malt says a great deal about the state of the category. For it, they selected 8+ single malts, which, true to the style's kaleidoscopic creativity, run the gamut from bouncy, fruit-forward malts, to heavily peated, to mesquite smoked, to even whiskey finished in applejack casks and more. It's a testament to Barrell's skill that the whiskey not only holds all those disparate flavors together, but allows them to open up and sing, bringing not just their own flavors to the table, but becoming something greater than the sum of their parts. It's a delightful dram, an encouraging sign for the future, and maybe even a little piece of American whiskey history. (116359)
