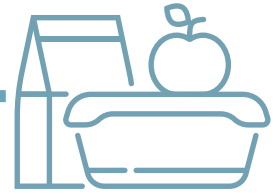


# FREE & REDUCED LUNCH

## 2022-2023 UPDATE



### Why are meals no longer free?

Over the past two years, the federal government allowed all students to eat free regardless of the learning environment or family financial situations. However, beginning on the first day of school for the 22-23 school year, students will be charged for both breakfast and lunch unless they qualify for free or reduced-price meals.

### I don't qualify for free or reduced-price meals. Do I need to do anything?

If you do not believe you qualify for free or reduced-price meals, please make sure that there is money in your student's account. You can add money to their account at [family.titank12.com](https://family.titank12.com).

### If I do qualify for free or reduced-price meals, what do I need to do?

If you do believe you qualify for free or reduced-price meals, please be sure to apply for free/reduced meals beginning July 1, 2022 for the 2022-2023 school year.

### What will meal prices be for 22-23?

Students who qualify for reduced-price meals do not need to pay for their meals. The State of Colorado has passed legislation that allows students who qualify for reduced-price meals to eat for free.

If your child qualifies for free meals, they will not be charged for breakfast or lunch but would need to pay for seconds or additional entrées.

Students who do not qualify for free or reduced-price meals will need to pay for their meals.
