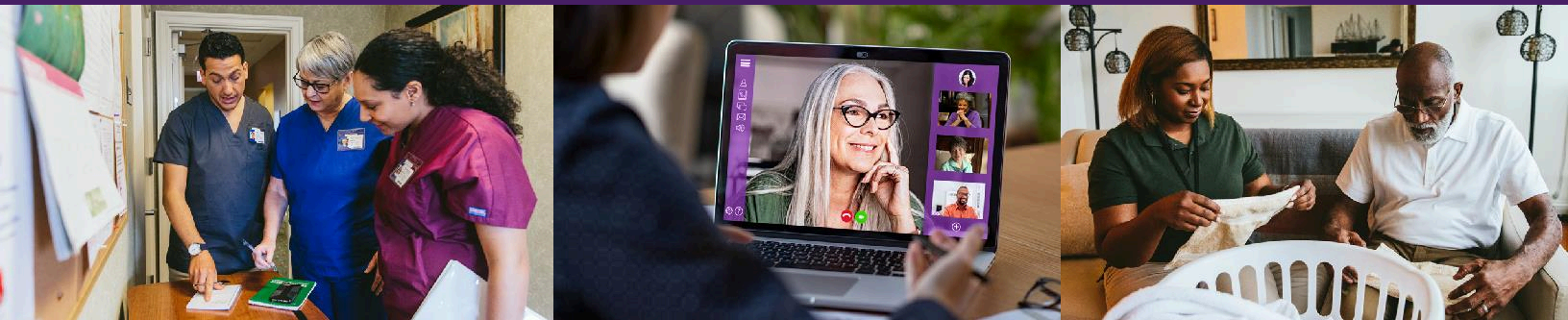

What is Project ECHO® (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes)?

- » Interactive Learning Model: Participate in engaging case-based discussions and brief didactic presentations to address real-life challenges and share experiences.
- » Collaborative Community: Join for six weeks of shared learning and growth in a virtual space where everyone contributes to and benefits from collective real-life knowledge.
- » Sessions include 10-to-12-minute presentations by the expert panel, followed by 45 minutes of real-life case presentations brought by participants.
