INSTALL LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES

Our primary goal is to ensure that every child has safe and easy access to a free book. So that no child will have more than a ten-minute walk to a free book, we have installed birdhouse-style Little Free Libraries at private homes, churches, and businesses in the neighborhoods with the lowest performing elementary schools.



MAINTAIN AND STOCK LIBRARIES

TAKE A BOOK | SHARE A BOOK

The concept is simple: take a book and return it after you have read it; share good things for children and adults to read. Dedicated stewards host a library on their property. They make sure it is in good repair and always filled with appropriate books. A team of caring volunteers restocks libraries every few weeks.



COLLECT AND READCYCLE BOOKS

Children have vivid imaginations and reading fuels their minds. Let their dreams take flight! Donate new or READcycle (collect and reuse) gently used, well-read books that can be enjoyed throughout our community. Children's books suitable for grades Pre-K-12 are preferred, with the following exceptions: NO textbooks, encyclopedias, magazines, or out-of-date reference materials.
