Good Afternoon BTHS Families:

The New Jersey Student Learning Assessments (NJSLA) are statewide assessments that evaluate students' progress toward the New Jersey Student Learning Standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics and Science. Freshmen enrolled in a semester 2 English class will take the exam for ELA on Monday, May 12th and Tuesday, May 13th. Freshmen enrolled in a semester 2 Math class will take the exam for Math on Wednesday, May 14th and Thursday, May 15th. Any student in grades 10-12 enrolled in Algebra I for the first time, must take the exam. Freshmen in a full year English or Mathematics course and students enrolled in a semester 2 Math or English class will take the NJSLA the week of May 12th - 15th. Only Juniors will take the exam for Science which will be given on Friday, May 16th and Monday, May 19th. Makeup testing for ELA and Math will also be on May 16th and 19th. Makeup testing for Science will be on May 20th.

Testing students are expected to arrive at school by 8:00 am. Students should bring their fully charged school-issued Chromebooks for testing. Personal devices are not approved for state testing purposes. The high school will be operating on the <u>State Testing Delayed Opening.</u>

We are encouraging every student who is medically able to attend the sessions to do so. Students who are sick, displaying symptoms, or who may be contagious, are asked to stay home and will take the assessment during the makeup testing window. Students who are **NOT** testing should report to their bus stops according to the times listed on the <u>State Testing Bus Schedule</u>. The bus numbers listed are the bus numbers students take when they leave school (PM bus numbers). Students who arrive before testing has ended will report to the following locations: Freshmen who are not testing will report to the Hopkins cafeteria. Sophomores will report to the main building cafeteria. Juniors and Seniors will report to the PAC. If you have any questions, please contact your child's school counselor.
