



NOTE: IF AN SAPC CONGREGANT OR STAFF MEMBER WHO HAS ATTENDED AN SAPC-SANCTIONED ACTIVITY (WHETHER ON CAMPUS OR OFF CAMPUS) TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 WITHIN 14 DAYS OF THEIR PARTICIPATION, THEY ARE TO CONTACT PASTOR HAMMERSLEY SO THAT REQUIRED ACTIONS ARE TAKEN. IN THE EVENT PASTOR HAMMERSLEY IS NOT AVAILABLE, THEN THE INDIVIDUAL IS TO CONTACT CLERK OF SESSION, KELLY FRONTROTH.

SAPC POLICY FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 or INDIVIDUALS EXPOSED TO A PERSON WHO IS SYMPTOMATIC OR HAS TESTED POSITIVE:

SAPC Congregants or Staff members with symptoms of COVID-19: Congregants or Staff shall be excluded from physically attending SAPC-sanctioned activities on or off the SAPC campus if they have any of the following symptoms, with or without fever, UNLESS these symptoms are explainable by an underlying medical condition (such as shortness of breath for an individual with asthma):

- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Loss of taste or smell
- New or worsening cough.

Congregants and Staff who are automatically excluded from SAPC-sanctioned activities on or off SAPC campus due to the conditions above will not be allowed to attend subsequent SAPC-sanctioned activities on or off SAPC campus until they have met the Quarantine and Return to Church criteria specified below.

This is not a complete list of all symptoms of COVID-19, but only those that should trigger an automatic exclusion from SAPC-sanctioned activities on or off SAPC campus.

Other symptoms to be considered may include: fever, chills, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea/vomiting, or diarrhea. Out of respect for their fellow church members, individuals experiencing any of these other symptoms are asked to not attend SAPC-sanctioned activities until they are fully recovered.

QUARANTINE and RETURN TO IN-PERSON PARTICIPATION IN SAPC-SANCTIONED ACTIVITIES:

All SAPC Congregants or Staff members having to be quarantined are advised that they may not participate in SAPC-sanctioned activities on or off the SAPC campus until they have met the following criteria for return:

- SAPC Congregants or Staff members excluded for the symptoms identified above should not return to SAPC-sanctioned activities until they have either tested negative for COVID-19, have spent 10 days in isolation and symptoms have been absent for at least 24 hours, or a medical evaluation determines that their symptoms were more likely due to another cause (e.g. sore throat due to strep throat). In the latter case, the individual may return when they have fully recovered from that condition.
- Current isolation criteria for COVID-19: SAPC Congregants or Staff members who test positive for COVID-19 and persons with symptoms of COVID-19 who do not get tested, should isolate until:
 - Ten (10) days have passed since symptoms started - and –
 - Twenty-four (24) hours have passed since last fever without taking medicine to reduce fever - and –

- Overall improvement in symptoms.
- SAPC Congregants or Staff members who test positive by a PCR (mouth or throat swab) test or similar viral test but do not have symptoms will be prohibited from participating in SAPC-sanctioned activities on or off the SAPC campus until ten (10) days after the specimen was collected and at least 24 hours have lapsed since the presence of symptoms.
- Any SAPC Congregant or Staff member known to be in close contact (defined as being within six (6) feet for fifteen (15) minutes or more) to a confirmed COVID-19 case shall be excluded from SAPC-sanctioned activities on or off the SAPC campus for fourteen (14) days after last contact with the infected person.
- Household contact: If the SAPC Congregant or Staff member lives in the same household as someone who tests positive for COVID-19, they are prohibited from attending SAPC-sanctioned activities on or off the SAPC campus for fourteen (14) days after the date their household member has been cleared from their isolation period.
- Anyone who knowingly has been exposed within the past 14 days to anyone known to be infected with COVID-19 should remain at home for 14 days after the exposure and remain absent from SAPC sanctioned activities.
